SUMMARY—Expresses sense of Nevada Legislature regarding reading proficiency of Nevada's school children. (BDR 34-15)

AN ACT relating to education; expressing the sense of the Nevada Legislature regarding available methods to improve the reading proficiency of Nevada's school children at an early grade level; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** 1. The Nevada Legislature declares that:
2 (a) It is essential to the educational success of the children who are
3 enrolled in Nevada's public schools that they learn to read with proficiency
4 at an early grade level;
5 (b) The acquisition of reading and literacy grants provided through the
6 Reading Excellence Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 6661 et seq., would greatly enhance
7 the ability of this state to increase the reading proficiency of Nevada's
8 school children;
9 (c) The intended goal of the Nevada Legislature is to increase the
10 reading proficiency of Nevada's school children at an early grade level and
11 to establish the optimal conditions for the receipt of reading and literacy
12 grants provided through the Reading Excellence Act; and
13 (d) In furtherance of its intended goal, the Nevada Legislature hereby
14 states that it is in support of:
15 (1) The establishment of a plan pursuant to which the Governor and
16 the Department of Education will establish a reading and literacy
17 partnership in accordance with the requirements of 20 U.S.C. § 6661b(d) to
18 ensure that all applications and proposals for reading and literacy grants
19 provided through the Reading Excellence Act are presented in such a
20 manner as to produce an outcome resulting in the maximum financial and
21 educational benefit for this state;



- 1 (2) The availability and delivery of professional development
2 activities for the teachers who are employed in this state that are:
3 (I) Related to providing instruction in reading;
4 (II) Based upon scientifically based reading research; and
5 (III) Founded on a balanced approach to providing instruction in
6 reading that prepares teachers in the major components of reading,
7 including, without limitation, phonemic awareness, systematic phonics,
8 spelling, vocabulary, fluency, reading comprehension and writing;
9 (3) The use of technology, as appropriate, to enhance the professional
10 development activities described in subparagraph (2);
11 (4) The participation of parents and legal guardians in activities
12 related to reading and literacy in a manner that will enhance the ability of
13 their children to learn;
14 (5) The provision of family literacy services that are based upon
15 programs such as the Even Start Family Literacy Program; and
16 (6) The development of mechanisms to assess and evaluate, on a
17 regular basis, the progress made by the school districts in this state in
18 enhancing the reading proficiency of Nevada's school children at an early
19 grade level.
20 2. As used in this section:
21 (a) "Reading" has the meaning ascribed to it in 20 U.S.C. § 6661a(4).
22 (b) "Scientifically based reading research" has the meaning ascribed to
23 in 20 U.S.C. § 6661a(5).
24 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
