

Enacted joint resolutions are those passed by the Legislature and assigned a file number in the *Statues of Nevada*. Joint resolutions, which seek to amend the Nevada Constitution, must be passed by two Sessions of the Legislature and then be submitted to the people for a vote.

Enacted concurrent and one-house resolutions are those adopted by the Legislature and assigned a file number in the *Statutes of Nevada*.
