SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing form for application to register to vote. (BDR 24-869)

AN ACT relating to elections; revising the provisions governing the form for an application to register to vote; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 293.507 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 293.507 1. The secretary of state shall prescribe:
 - (a) A standard form for applications to register to vote; and
 - (b) A special form for registration to be used in a county where
- 5 registrations are performed and records of registration are kept by 6 computer.
- The county clerks shall provide forms for applications to register to vote to field registrars in the form and number prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 3. A form for an application to register to vote must include a
- duplicate copy marked as the receipt to be retained by the applicant upon completion of the form.
 - 4. The form for an application to register to vote must include:
- (a) A line [on which to enter the number on] for use by the county clerk to enter:
- 16 (1) The first two letters of the name of the county in which the voter 17 is applying to vote;
 - (2) The first two letters of the last name of the voter;

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- 19 (3) A six-digit number composed of the last two digits of the year of
- 20 the birth of the voter, followed by two digits representing the month of

the birth of the voter followed by two digits representing the day of the
 birth of the voter; and

- 4 (4) The last four digits of the voter's social security [card, driver's license or identification card issued by the department of motor vehicles and public safety.] number if provided by the voter without objection. If the last four digits of the social security number are not provided by the voter, a four-digit number assigned by the county clerk.
- 8 (b) A line on which to enter the address at which the voter actually
 9 resides. The application must not be accepted if the address is listed as a
 10 post office box unless a street address has not been assigned to his
 11 residence.
- 12 (c) A notice that the voter may not list his address as a business unless 13 he actually resides there.

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
