SUMMARY—Revises requirements for licensure as operator of or instructor for school for training drivers. (BDR 43-747)

AN ACT relating to driver education; requiring applicants for licensure as operators of or instructors for schools for training drivers to submit their fingerprints for processing by the Federal Bureau of Investigation; abolishing the requirement that such persons hold a driving instructor's certificate issued by the state department of education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 483.710 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 483.710 An applicant for a license to operate a school for training
- 3 drivers must:

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- 1. Be of good moral character.
 - 2. Maintain an established place of business open to the public which
- is not within 200 feet of any building used by the department as an office.
- 3. Have the equipment necessary to give proper instruction in the
- 8 operation of motor vehicles.
- 9 4. Be 21 years of age or older.
 - 5. [Hold a valid driving instructor's certificate issued by the state
- 11 department of education in accordance with regulations prescribed by the
- 12 state board of education governing the qualifications of instructors in
- 13 privately owned schools for training drivers.] For initial licensure, submit

- with his application a complete set of his fingerprints and written
 permission authorizing the department to forward those fingerprints to
 the central repository for Nevada records of criminal history for
 submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report.
- 6. Submit a fee for the processing of fingerprints submitted pursuant to subsection 5. The department shall establish by regulation the fee for processing fingerprints. The fee must not exceed the sum of the amounts charged by the central repository for Nevada records of criminal history and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for processing the fingerprints.
- File with the department a surety bond in the amount of \$10,000 to 10 the department, executed by the applicant as principal with a corporation 11 authorized to transact surety business in this state as surety. The bond must 12 be continuous in form and conditioned that the operator conduct the 13 business of the school as an instructional institution without fraud or fraudulent representation. Upon application by an operator, the department 15 may reduce the amount of the bond required to an amount not less than 16 \$5,000 if the operator has satisfactorily conducted his school for the 5 17 years immediately preceding the application for reduction. 18
- Sec. 2. NRS 483.720 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 483.720 An applicant for a license as an instructor for a school for training drivers must:
- 22 1. Be of good moral character;

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- 23 2. Pass such examination as the department may require on traffic laws, safe driving practices and operation of motor vehicles;
- 25 3. Be physically able to operate a motor vehicle safely and train others in the operation of motor vehicles;
 - 4. Hold a valid Nevada driver's license;
 - 5. Be 21 years of age or older; [and
 - 6. Hold a valid driving instructor's certificate issued by the state department of education in accordance with regulations prescribed by the state board of education governing the qualifications of instructors in privately owned schools for training drivers.]
- 6. For initial licensure, submit with his application a complete set of his fingerprints and written permission authorizing the department to forward those fingerprints to the central repository for Nevada records of criminal history for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report; and
- 7. Submit a fee for the processing of fingerprints submitted pursuant subsection 6. The department shall establish by regulation the fee for

- processing fingerprints. The fee must not exceed the sum of the amounts charged by the central repository for Nevada records of criminal history and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for processing the fingerprints.

 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
