SUMMARY—Provides for public review of textbooks used in public schools. (BDR 34-1086)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring that parents and members of the general public be afforded an opportunity to review textbooks and supplemental textbooks for use in the public schools; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 390 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. Before a school district selects, approves for selection or purchases supplemental textbooks for use in the public schools in the school district
- 5 other than charter schools, the school district shall afford the parents
- 6 and legal guardians of pupils who are enrolled in public schools in the
- 7 school district and other members of the general public an opportunity
- 8 *to*:

- (a) Review the supplemental textbooks proposed for selection; and
- (b) Submit written comments concerning the supplemental textbooks proposed for selection.
- 2. A school district shall not select, approve for selection or purchase a supplemental textbook for use in the public schools of the school district unless the school district included the supplemental textbook for the review required pursuant to subsection 1.
- This section does not prohibit a charter school from using supplemental textbooks other than those made available for review pursuant to this section.
- **Sec. 2.** NRS 390.005 is hereby amended to read as follows: 11

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- As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:
- "Basic textbook" or "textbook" means any medium or manual of instruction, including, without limitation, software for computers and *videotapes*, containing a presentation of the principles of a subject and used as a basis of instruction.
- "Supplemental textbook" means any medium or material, including, without limitation, software for computers and videotapes, used to reinforce or extend a basic program of instruction.
- A basic or supplemental textbook becomes "unserviceable" [when] after 4 years have elapsed since its removal from the adopted list.
- **Sec. 3.** NRS 390.140 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 390.140 1. The state board shall make the final selection of all textbooks to be used in the public schools in this state, except for charter schools. Before the state board makes a final selection of textbooks, the state board shall afford the parents and legal guardians of pupils who are enrolled in public schools and other members of the general public an opportunity to:
  - (a) Review the textbooks proposed for selection by the state board; and
- 30 (b) Submit written comments concerning the textbooks proposed for selection. 31
- 2. A school district may prepare a list of textbooks for consideration by the state board. In preparing such a list, a school district shall afford 34 the parents and legal guardians of pupils who are enrolled in public schools in the school district and other members of the general public an opportunity to: 36
- (a) Review the textbooks proposed for consideration by the state 37 38 board; and
- (b) Submit written comments concerning the textbooks proposed for 39 consideration by the state board. 40
- A school district may submit a list that has been prepared in 41 42 accordance with subsection 2 to the state board for consideration if the list accompanied 43

- (a) Proof that the school district complied with the provisions of subsection 2; and
- (b) The comments, if any, submitted by parents, legal guardians and other members of the general public.
- 4. A textbook must not be selected by the state board pursuant to subsection 1 for use in the public schools in classes in literature, history or social sciences unless it accurately portrays the cultural and racial diversity of our society, including lessons on the contributions made to our society by men and women from various racial and ethnic backgrounds.
  - **Sec. 4.** NRS 390.230 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 390.230 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the textbooks adopted by the state board must be used in the public schools in this state, and no other books may be used as basic textbooks.
  - 2. This section does not prohibit:

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- (a) The continued use of such textbooks previously approved until they become unserviceable.
- (b) The use of supplemental textbooks [purchased] selected by a school district with the approval of the superintendent of public instruction.
- (c) After approval by the state board, the temporary use of textbooks for tryout purposes.
- (d) A charter school from using textbooks other than those adopted for use by the state board.
- 3. The superintendent of public instruction shall not grant his approval for the purposes of paragraph (b) of subsection 2 unless the school district submits proof that it complied with the requirements of section 1 of this act in selecting the supplemental textbooks.
- **4.** Any school officer or teacher who violates the provisions of this chapter, or knowingly fails to follow the regulations of the state board relating to *the* use of textbooks shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250.
- 31 [4.] 5. All superintendents, principals, teachers and school officers are charged with the execution of this section.
  - **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.

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
