AN ACT making an appropriation to the Department of Education for the extension of teachers' contracts by 2 days to provide professional development for teachers; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the state general
- fund to the Department of Education for the extension of teachers'
- 3 contracts by 2 days to provide professional development for each teacher:
- 4 For the fiscal year 1999-2000.....\$9,000,000
- 2. The money appropriated by subsection 1 must be distributed to each
- school district at the same time and in the same proportion as the
- 8 Superintendent of Public Instruction apportions money from the state
- 9 distributive school account.
- Sec. 2. 1. The board of trustees of each school district shall, not later
- than December 31, 2000, submit to the Superintendent of Public
- 12 Instruction a report setting forth the details of the activities for professional
- development in which each teacher participated as a result of the additional
- 14 2 days.

- 2. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall, not later than March 1, 2001, report to the 71st session of the Nevada Legislature regarding the efficacy of the programs for professional development with the money appropriated by section 1 of this act.

  Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.
