AN ACT relating to elections; revising the period of residency for certain candidates for public office; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 293.1755 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 293.1755 1. [In addition to any other requirement provided by law,
- 3 no person may Except as otherwise provided by specific statute, a person

- The provisions of this section do not apply to candidates for the office of district attorney.

A nickname of not more than 10 letters may be incorporated into [a candidate's name.] the name of a candidate. The nickname must be in quotation marks and appear immediately before the [candidate's surname.] surname of the candidate. A nickname must not indicate any political, economic, social or religious view or affiliation and must not be the name of any person, living or dead, whose reputation is known on a statewide, nationwide or worldwide basis, or in any other manner deceive a voter regarding the person or principles for which he is voting.
- 4. The address of a candidate which must be included in the declaration of candidacy or acceptance of candidacy pursuant to subsection 2 must be the street address of the residence where he actually resides, if one has been assigned. The declaration or acceptance of candidacy must not be accepted for filing if the [candidate's] address of the candidate is listed as a post office box unless a street address has not been assigned to his residence.
- Sec. 3. NRS 293C.185 is hereby amended to read as follows: 293C.185 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 293C.190, a name may not be printed on a ballot to be used at a primary city election, unless the person named has filed a declaration of candidacy or an acceptance of candidacy and paid the fee established by the governing body of the city not earlier than 40 days before the primary city election and not later than 5 p.m. on the 30th day before the primary city election.

[In addition to any other requirement provided by law, no person may] Except as otherwise provided by specific statute, a person is not eligible to be a candidate for a city office unless, for at least [30 days] 6 months before the [close of filing of declarations or acceptances] last day for filing a declaration of candidacy or an acceptance of candidacy for the office that he seeks, he has been a legal resident of the city or other area prescribed by law to which the office pertains and, if elected, over which he will have jurisdiction or which he will represent.
- 2. [Any] A person who knowingly and willfully files a declaration of candidacy or an acceptance of candidacy that contains a false statement in this respect is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- 23 3. [Any] A person convicted pursuant to the provisions of this section 24 is disqualified from entering upon the duties of the office for which he was 25 a candidate.
- Sec. 5. The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses that were committed before July 1, 1999.
- Sec. 6. This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.

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
