SUMMARY—Authorizes governing body of county to donate surplus personal property to nonprofit organization. (BDR 20-111)

AN ACT relating to counties; extending the authority to make charitable grants to include surplus personal property; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 244.1505 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 244.1505 1. A board of county commissioners may expend money
- 3 for any purpose which will provide a substantial benefit to the inhabitants
- 4 of the county. The board may grant all or part of the money to a private
  - organization, not for profit, to be expended for the selected purpose.
- A board of county commissioners may donate personal property
- 6
- that is owned by the county but no longer needed to a private
- organization, not for profit, to be used for any purpose which will provide
- a substantial benefit to the inhabitants of the county.
- A grant *or donation* to a private organization must be made by 10
- 11 resolution which must specify:

- (a) The purpose of the grant ; or donation; 12
  - (b) The maximum amount to be expended from [the] a grant; and
- (c) Any conditions or other limitations upon its expenditure  $\Theta$  or use. 14
- **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval. 15
