

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 289—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

SUMMARY—Enacts provisions governing operation of vending machines located in visitors' areas of institutions and facilities of department of prisons. (BDR 16-859)

AN ACT relating to the department of prisons; enacting provisions governing the operation of vending machines located in the visitors' areas of institutions and facilities of the department; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE  
AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1     **Section 1.** Chapter 209 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a  
2 new section to read as follows:  
3     ***1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the department shall***  
4 ***operate any vending machine that is located in a visitors' area of a***  
5 ***facility or an institution of the department.***  
6     ***2. The department may enter into a contract with a private vendor to***  
7 ***operate a vending machine located in a visitors' area of a facility or an***  
8 ***institution of the department.***  
9     ***3. If the department operates a vending machine pursuant to***  
10 ***subsection 1 or enters into a contract with a private vendor to operate a***  
11 ***vending machine pursuant to subsection 2, the money received by the***  
12 ***department from the operation of the vending machine, less any money***  
13 ***expended for overhead and operating expenses, must be deposited in the***  
14 ***offenders' store fund created pursuant to NRS 209.221.***  
15     ***4. As used in this section, "vending machine" means any manual or***  
16 ***coin-operated machine or similar device for vending food, beverages or***  
17 ***other articles.***

1     **Sec. 2.**   This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.

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
