AN ACT making an appropriation to the University and Community College System of Nevada for programs designed to improve the writing skills of teachers and pupils; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the state general
- 2 fund to the University and Community College System of Nevada for
- 3 programs designed to improve the writing skills of teachers and pupils:
 - For the fiscal year 1999-2000.....\$100,000
- 5 For the fiscal year 2000-2001.....\$100,000
- 2. The money appropriated by subsection 1 must be allocated equally
- between programs in Washoe and Clark Counties for deposit in separate
- 8 accounts for each program.

- 3. Disbursements from these accounts to pay the expenses of the
- programs must be made by the Board of Regents of the University of
- Nevada upon the request of the administrator of the respective program.

- 4. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for either fiscal year. Any balance of those sums must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2001, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
