SUMMARY—Makes appropriation to Department of Education for award of grants to schools that have established programs for peer mediation and conflict resolution. (BDR S-1173)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Department of Education for the award of grants to schools that have established programs for peer mediation and conflict resolution; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

- WHEREAS, Based on national and state research, the members of the
- Nevada Legislature hereby declare that:

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- 1. Violence in the schools within the State of Nevada is unacceptable;
- 2. Programs using peer mediation and conflict resolution have been
- 5 demonstrated to be effective methods of curbing school violence in other
- 6 jurisdictions throughout the United States; and
  - 3. Programs that use peer mediation and conflict resolution in certain
- 8 schools in this state have reduced the incidence of violence between pupils
- 9 and against the staff of the schools; now, therefore,

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

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- **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the state general fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$50,000 for the award of grants to schools that have established programs for peer mediation and conflict resolution.
- 9 **Sec. 2.** 1. The Department of Education shall use the money appropriated by section 1 of this act to award grants to schools that have established programs for peer mediation or conflict resolution. The Department shall give priority to those schools that have a high incidence of:
  - (a) Violence between pupils;
  - (b) Violence directed against teachers or other members of the staff;
- (c) Violence involving weapons; or
- (d) Any combination of paragraph (a), (b) or (c).
- 2. Each grant awarded pursuant to subsection 1 must not exceed \$2,500. The grants must not be used for the administrative salaries of school administrators.
- 3. Participating schools may submit an application for a grant to the Department of Education and each grant must be awarded on a competitive basis according to the criteria set forth in subsection 1.
- Sec. 3. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2001, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
- Sec. 4. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
