## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 426-COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE AND MINING

## MARCH 8, 1999

## Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Provides that irrigation districts that generate, produce, transmit and sell electricity are not subject to jurisdiction of public utilities commission of Nevada. (BDR 58-1318)

AN ACT relating to irrigation districts; providing that irrigation districts that generate, produce, transmit and sell electric power or energy are not public utilities subject to the jurisdiction of the public utilities commission of Nevada; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 704.020 is hereby amended to read as follows: 1
- 704.020 1. "Public utility" or "utility" includes:
- (a) Any person who owns, operates, manages or controls any railroad or
- part of a railroad as a common carrier in this state, or cars or other
- equipment used thereon, or bridges, terminals, or sidetracks, or any docks
- or wharves or storage elevators used in connection therewith, whether or
- not they are owned by the railroad.
- (b) Telephone companies and other companies which provide
- telecommunication or a related service to the public.
- (c) Radio or broadcasting instrumentalities providing common or 10 contract service.

- (d) All companies which own cars of any kind or character, used and 12
- operated as a part of railroad trains, in or through this state. All duties
- required of and penalties imposed upon any railroad or any officer or agent
- thereof are, insofar as applicable, required of and imposed upon the owner 15
- operator of any telephone, radio and broadcasting companies, 16

companies providing telecommunication or related services to the public and companies which own cars of any kind or character, used and operated as a part of railroad trains in or through this state, and their officers and agents, and the commission may supervise and control all such companies and persons to the same extent as railroads.

"Public utility" or "utility" also includes:

- (a) Any person who owns, operates or controls any ditch, flume, tunnel or tunnel and drainage system, charging rates, fares or tolls, directly or indirectly.
- (b) Any plant or equipment, or any part of a plant or equipment, within this state for the production, delivery or furnishing for or to other persons, including private or municipal corporations, heat, gas, coal slurry, light, power in any form or by any agency, water for business, manufacturing, agricultural or household use, or sewerage service, whether or not within the limits of municipalities.
- (c) Any system for the distribution of liquefied petroleum gas to 10 or more users.
- The commission may supervise, regulate and control all such utilities, subject to the provisions of this chapter and to the exclusion of the jurisdiction, regulation and control of such utilities by any municipality, town or village, unless otherwise provided by law.
- The provisions of this chapter and the term "public utility" apply to all railroads, express companies, car companies and all associations of persons, whether or not incorporated, that do any business as a common carrier upon or over any line of railroad within this state.
- "Public utility" or "utility" does not include an irrigation district that generates, produces, transmits and sells electric power or electrical energy in any form in accordance with chapter 539 of NRS. 28
  - **Sec. 2.** NRS 704.970 is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - "Electric distribution utility" means a utility that is in the 704.970 business of supplying noncompetitive electric distribution or transmission service, or both, or a noncompetitive service pursuant to NRS 704.982, on or after July 1, 1999, or the date on which alternative sellers are authorized to provide potentially competitive services to customers in this state, as appropriate. The term does not include an irrigation district that generates, produces, transmits and sells electric power or electrical energy in any form in accordance with chapter 539 of NRS.
- 38 **Sec. 3.** NRS 539.237 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 539.237 1. The board of directors may: 39
  - (a) Generate, produce, transmit and sell electric power or electrical energy in any form in furtherance of the purposes of this chapter.
- 42 (b) Acquire or contract for the delivery of electric power and electric transmission power

lines.

- 2. In any irrigation district having a reservoir or reservoirs for the storage of water with a capacity of less than 250,000 acre-feet, the board may not acquire or contract for the construction or acquisition of electric power or transmission lines at a cost exceeding the sum of \$50,000 without first obtaining the approval of the electors of the district at a special election, district election or primary or general state election.
- 3. In any irrigation district having a reservoir or reservoirs for the storage of water with a capacity of 250,000 acre-feet or more, the board may not acquire or contract for the construction or acquisition of electric power or transmission lines at a cost exceeding the sum of \$100,000 without first obtaining the approval of the electors of the district at a special election, district election or primary or general state election.
- 4. An irrigation district that generates, produces, transmits and sells electric power or electrical energy in any form in furtherance of the purposes of this chapter is not a utility subject to the jurisdiction of the public utilities commission of Nevada.
- 7 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
