AN ACT relating to the practice of interior design; revising the provisions governing the qualifications of an applicant for a certificate of registration; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 623.192 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 623.192 1. An applicant for a certificate of registration to practice as
- a registered interior designer must be of good moral character and submit to the board:
- (a) An application on a form provided by the board;
- (b) The fees required pursuant to NRS 623.310;
 - (c) The statement required pursuant to NRS 623.225;
 - (d) Proof which is satisfactory to the board that he has completed:
- 9 (1) At least 5 years of education in a program of interior design or an equivalent number of credits and at least 1 year of experience in interior design;
- (2) At least 4 years of education in a program of interior design or an equivalent number of credits and at least 2 years of experience in interior design:
- (3) At least 3 years of education in a program of interior design or an equivalent number of credits and at least 3 years of experience in interior design;

- (4) At least 2 years of education in a program of interior design or an equivalent number of credits and at least 4 years of experience in interior design; or
- (5) At least 6 consecutive years of experience in the practice of interior design; and
- (e) A certificate issued by the National Council for Interior Design Qualification as proof that he has passed the examination prepared and administered by that organization.
- 2. Each program of interior design must be accredited by the
 Foundation for Interior Design Education Research or approved by [the
 board.
 - (a) The board; or

- (b) An accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of Education.
- 3. The board shall, by regulation, adopt the standards of the National Council for Interior Design Qualification for the experience and equivalent credits required pursuant to subsection 1 as those standards exist on the date of the adoption of the regulation.
- 4. Any application submitted to the board may be denied for any violation of the provisions of this chapter.
 - **Sec. 2.** NRS 623.192 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 623.192 1. An applicant for a certificate of registration to practice as a registered interior designer must be of good moral character and submit to the board:
 - (a) An application on a form provided by the board;
 - (b) The fees required pursuant to NRS 623.310;
 - (c) The statement required pursuant to NRS 623.225;
 - (d) Proof which is satisfactory to the board that he has completed:
- 29 (1) At least 5 years of education in a program of interior design or an 30 equivalent number of credits and at least 1 year of experience in interior 31 design; [or]
 - (2) At least 4 years of education in a program of interior design or an equivalent number of credits and at least 2 years of experience in interior design;
 - (3) At least 3 years of education in a program of interior design or an equivalent number of credits and at least 3 years of experience in interior design; or
- 38 (4) At least 2 years of education in a program of interior design or 39 an equivalent number of credits and at least 4 years of experience in 40 interior design; and
- (e) A certificate issued by the National Council for Interior Design
 Qualification as proof that he has passed the examination prepared and

- 2. Each program of interior design must be accredited by the
- Foundation for Interior Design Education Research or approved by [the
 board.]:

- 5 (b) An accrediting body recognized by the United States Department 6 of Education.
- 7 3. The board shall, by regulation, adopt the standards of the National Council for Interior Design Qualification for the experience and equivalent credits required pursuant to subsection 1 as those standards exist on the date of the adoption of the regulation.
- 4. Any application submitted to the board may be denied for any violation of the provisions of this chapter.
- Sec. 3. 1. This section and section 1 of this act become effective on October 1, 1999.
- 2. Section 1 of this act expires by limitation on December 31, 1999.
- 3. Section 2 of this act becomes effective at 12:01 a.m. on January 1, 2000.
