## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 440–COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE AND MINING

AN ACT relating to recreational areas; authorizing the imposition of a fee upon certain persons who reside in state housing within state parks and other recreational areas; providing that the money raised from such fees may be used only for the repair, maintenance and renovation of such housing; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 407 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. The administrator, with the approval of the director, may establish and collect a fee from those state employees, volunteers and contractual
- 5 employees who reside in housing owned and maintained by the division
- 6 within the various state parks and recreational areas, for the repair,
- 7 maintenance and renovation of such housing.
  - 2. All money collected pursuant to this section must be:
- 9 (a) Deposited in the account for maintenance of state parks within the
- 10 division of state parks created in NRS 407.0762;
- 11 (b) Accounted for separately; and

- 1 (c) Used only for the repair, maintenance and renovation of housing owned and maintained by the division within the various state parks and 3 recreational areas.
- 3. The administrator, subject to the approval of the director, may expend money pursuant to subsection 2.

  Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.
