AN ACT relating to state parks; revising the provisions governing the expenditure of money from the account for the repair and maintenance of state parks, monuments and recreational areas; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. NRS 407.0762 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 407.0762 1. The account for maintenance of state parks within the
- 3 division of state parks is hereby created in the state general fund. Except as
- 4 otherwise provided in NRS 407.0765, any amount of fees collected
- 5 pursuant to subsection 4 of NRS 407.065 in a calendar year, which is in
- 6 excess of the amounts authorized for expenditure from that revenue source
- 7 in the division's budget for the fiscal year beginning in that calendar year,
- 8 must be deposited in the account. The interest and income earned on the
- 9 money in the account, after deducting any applicable charges, must be
- 10 credited to the account.
- 11 2. The money in the account does not lapse to the state general fund at the end of any fiscal year.
- 3. The money deposited in the account pursuant to subsection 1 must
- only be used to repair and maintain state parks, monuments and
- 15 recreational areas.

- 1 4. Before the administrator may expend money pursuant to subsection 2 3:
- 3 (a) For emergency repairs [,] and projects with a cost of less than 4 \$25,000, he must first receive the approval of the director.
- (b) For [purposes] projects with a cost of \$25,000 or more, other than emergency repairs, he must first receive the approval of the director and of the interim finance committee.
  - Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.
