AN ACT relating to the department of museums, library and arts; requiring the administrator of the division of museums and history of the department to appoint the director of the Nevada state museum; removing certain obsolete provisions; changing the titles of certain employees of the department; authorizing the board of museums and history of the department to establish reasonable fees for certain services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. NRS 381.008 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 381.008 When not in conflict with any condition or restraint placed on
- a gift and with the approval of the board, the director for curator of each
- 4 institution of the division may sell duplicates, surplus and items
- 5 inappropriate to the collection of the institution. The proceeds of the sale
