AN ACT relating to the department of museums, library and arts; revising the qualifications of the director of the department; requiring the administrator of the division of museums and history of the department to appoint the director of the Nevada state museum; removing certain obsolete provisions; revising the titles and classification of certain employees of the department; authorizing the board of museums and history of the department to establish reasonable fees for certain services; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 378.0086 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 378.0086 The director:
- 1. Is appointed by and responsible to the governor, and serves at the
- 4 pleasure of the governor.
- 5 2. Is in the unclassified service of the state.
 - 3. Shall not engage in any other gainful employment or occupation.
 - 4. Must be selected with special reference to training, experience,
- 8 capacity and interest in cultural resources, arts or library or archive
- 9 management, or any combination thereof. His knowledge and abilities
- 10 must include, without limitation:

- (a) A comprehensive knowledge of administrative principles and a working knowledge of broad principles relating to subject matters under his administrative direction;
- (b) The administrative ability to assess the adequacy of agency operations and the protection of the public interest as related to the subject matters:
- (c) The ability to organize and present oral and written communications to the governor, the legislature and other pertinent officials or persons; and
- (d) The ability to oversee the carrying out of the statutory 10 responsibilities of the department and of the policies, rules and 11 regulations of the department. 12
- 5. Must have demonstrated ability and 4 years of experience 13 administering a major public agency fin the field of museums, libraries or arts, or a related agency.] or in business administration. 15
 - 6. Must have [an advanced degree in the humanities, history, science, the arts, library science, or a related field, or in public administration.] a degree from an accredited 4-year college or university.
