ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 529—ASSEMBLYMEN NEIGHBORS, BACHE, GIUNCHIGLIANI, WILLIAMS, LEE, CHOWNING, COLLINS AND PARKS

MARCH 15, 1999

Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing group insurance for employees of certain local governmental entities. (BDR 23-728)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State or on Industrial Insurance: Yes.

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EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to programs for public employees; providing in skeleton form for the revision of provisions relating to group insurance for employees of certain local governmental entities; creating a committee on local government insurance; establishing the duties of the committee; authorizing the committee on benefits to hire certain employees; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 287 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this act.
- Sec. 2. The committee on local government insurance is hereby
- 4 created. The committee consists of seven members appointed as follows:
- 5 1. One member appointed by the governing body of the Nevada
- 6 League of Cities, or its successor organization.
- 7 2. One member appointed by the governing body of the Nevada
- 8 Association of Counties, or its successor organization.
- 9 3. One member appointed by the Nevada Association of School Boards, or its successor organization.
- 11 4. Three members appointed by the governor from lists of persons
- 12 nominated by employee organizations representing employees of local
- 13 governments that participate in the local governments' program of group 14 insurance.
- 5. One member of the public at large appointed by the governor, who shall serve as the chairman of the committee.

- Sec. 3. The committee on local government insurance shall:
- 1. Establish and carry out a program to be known as the local governments' program of group insurance to secure group life, accident or health insurance, or any combination of these for the benefit of officers, employees and retired employees of local governments that participate in the program.
 - 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, negotiate and contract with the governing body of any local government enumerated in NRS 287.010 which is desirous of obtaining group insurance for its officers, employees and retired employees by participation in the local governments' program of group insurance.
- Give public notice in writing of proposed changes in rates or 13 coverage to each participating local government that may be affected by 14 the changes. Notice must be provided at least 30 days before the effective 15 date of the changes.
 - 4. Purchase policies of life, accident or health insurance, or any combination of these, from any company qualified to do business in this state for the benefit of all eligible officers, employees and retired employees who participate in the local governments' program of group insurance.
 - 5. Except as otherwise provided in this Title, develop and establish other employee benefits as necessary.
- Adopt such regulations and perform such other duties as the 23 committee determines to be necessary, including, without limitation, regulations to establish:
- (a) Fees for applications for participation in the local governments' 26 program of group insurance and for the late payment of premiums; 27
- (b) Conditions for entry and reentry into the local governments' 28 29 program of group insurance by local governments enumerated in NRS 287.010; and 30
- (c) The levels of participation in the local governments' program of 31 group insurance required for officers, employees and retired employees 32 of participating local governments. 33
- Sec. 4. 1. The committee on benefits shall employ an executive 34 officer and a chief accountant, both of whom must be selected by 35 majority vote of the committee. The executive officer and chief accountant are in the unclassified service of the state and serve at the 37 pleasure of the committee.
 - The executive officer must:

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(a) Be a graduate of a 4-year college or university with a degree in 40 41 business administration or public administration or an equivalent degree, as determined by the committee; and

- (b) Possess at least 5 years of experience in a high-level administrative or executive capacity in the field of insurance, management of employees' benefits or risk management.
 - 3. The chief accountant must be a certified public accountant.
- 4. The committee may delegate to the executive officer the exercise or discharge of any power, duty or function vested in or imposed upon the committee.
- 5. The chief accountant shall conduct an annual audit of the state's program of group insurance and perform such other duties as the committee on benefits may require.
 - 6. The executive officer and the chief accountant are entitled to an annual salary fixed by the committee. The salaries of the executive officer and the chief accountant are exempt from the limitations set forth in NRS 281.123.
 - 7. The executive officer and the chief accountant shall not:

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- (a) Except as otherwise provided in NRS 284.143, pursue any other business or occupation or perform the duties of any other office of profit during normal office hours unless on leave approved in advance; or
- 19 (b) Participate in any business enterprise or investment with any vendor or provider to the state's program of group insurance.
- Sec. 5. The committee on benefits may employ such staff as is necessary to carry out the administration of the state's program of group insurance, including, without limitation, the processing of claims for benefits.
 - **Sec. 6.** NRS 287.023 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 287.023 1. Whenever an officer or employee of the governing body of any county, school district, municipal corporation, political subdivision, public corporation or other public agency of the State of Nevada retires under the conditions set forth in NRS 286.510 or 286.620 and, at the time
- of his retirement, was covered or had his dependents covered by any group
- insurance or medical and hospital service established pursuant to NRS
- 287.010 and 287.020, the officer or employee has the option upon
- 33 retirement to cancel or continue any such group insurance or join the
- 34 [state's] local governments' program of group insurance or medical and
- hospital service coverage to the extent that such coverage is not provided to him or a dependent by the Health Insurance for the Aged Act, 42
- 36 to film of a dependent by the Health insurance for the 37 U.S.C. §§ 1395 et seq. [...]
- 2. A retired person who continues coverage under the [state's] local governments' program of group insurance shall assume the portion of the premium or membership costs for the coverage continued which the governing body does not pay on behalf of retired officers or employees. A
- person who joins the [state's] local governments' program of group
- 43 insurance for the first time upon retirement shall assume all costs for the

- coverage. A dependent of such a retired person has the option, which may be exercised to the same extent and in the same manner as the retired person, to cancel or continue coverage in effect on the date the retired person dies. The dependent is not required to continue to receive retirement payments from the public employees' retirement system in order to continue coverage.
 - 3. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 287.0235, notice of the selection of the option must be given in writing to the last public employer of the officer or employee within 30 days after the date of retirement or death, as the case may be. If [no] notice is *not* given by that date, the retired employee and his dependents shall be deemed to have selected the option to cancel the coverage or not to join the [state's program,] local governments' program of group insurance, as the case may be.

- 4. The governing body of any county, school district, municipal corporation, political subdivision, public corporation or other public agency of this state may pay the cost, or any part of the cost, of group insurance and medical and hospital service coverage for persons eligible for that coverage under subsection 1, but it must not pay a greater portion than it does for its current officers and employees.
- **Sec. 7.** NRS 287.025 is hereby amended to read as follows: 287.025 The governing body of any county, school district, municipal corporation, political subdivision, public corporation or other public agency of the State of Nevada may, in addition to the other powers granted in NRS 287.010 and 287.020:
- 1. Negotiate and contract with any other such agency or with the committee on [benefits] local government insurance for the [state's] local governments' program of group insurance [plan] to secure group insurance for its officers and employees and their dependents by participation in any group insurance plan established or to be established or in the [state's] local governments' program of group insurance; [plan;] and
- 2. To secure group health insurance or related medical services for its officers and employees and their dependents, excluding industrial insurance, participate as a member of a nonprofit cooperative association or nonprofit corporation established in this state solely to purchase such insurance or medical services for its members from an insurer licensed pursuant to the provisions of Title 57 of NRS.
- Sec. 8. NRŜ 287.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 287.040 The provisions of NRS 287.010 to 287.040, inclusive, and
 sections 2 and 3 of this act do not make it compulsory upon any governing
 body of any county, school district, municipal corporation, political
 subdivision, public corporation or other public agency of the State of
 Nevada to make any contributions for the payment of any premiums or

other costs for group insurance or medical or hospital services, or upon any officer or employee of any county, school district, municipal corporation, political subdivision, public corporation or other public agency of this state to accept or join any plan of group insurance or to assign his wages or salary or to authorize deductions from his wages or salary in payment of premiums therefor.

- **Sec. 9.** NRS 287.043 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 287.043 The committee on benefits shall:

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- Act as an advisory body on matters relating to group life, accident or health insurance, or any combination of these, a program to reduce taxable compensation or other forms of compensation other than deferred 11 compensation, for the benefit of all state officers and employees. [and 12 other persons who participate in the state's program of group insurance. 13 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, negotiate and contract with the governing body of any public agency enumerated in NRS 15 287.010 which is desirous of obtaining group insurance for its officers, 16 employees and retired employees by participation in the state's program of 17 group insurance. The committee shall establish separate rates and coverage for those officers, employees and retired employees based on actuarial 20 reports.
- 23. Give public notice in writing of proposed changes in rates or coverage to each participating public employer who may be affected by the changes. Notice must be provided at least 30 days before the effective date of the changes.
 - [4.] 3. Purchase policies of life, accident or health insurance, or any combination of these, or a program to reduce the amount of taxable compensation pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 125, from any company qualified to do business in this state or provide similar coverage through a plan of self-insurance for the benefit of all eligible [public] state officers, employees and retired employees who participate in the state's program.
 - [5.] 4. Consult the state risk manager and obtain his advice in the performance of the duties set forth in this section.
- Except as otherwise provided in this Title, develop and establish other employee benefits as necessary.
 - [7.] 6. Adopt such regulations and perform such other duties as are necessary to carry out the provisions of NRS 287.041 to 287.049, inclusive, and sections 4 and 5 of this act including, without limitation, the establishment of:
- 39 (a) Fees for applications for participation in the state's program and for 40 the late payment of premiums;
- (b) Conditions for entry and reentry into the state's program by public agencies enumerated in NRS 287.010;

and

- (c) The levels of participation in the state's program required for employees of participating public agencies.
- [8. Appoint an independent certified public accountant. The accountant shall provide an annual audit of the plan and report to the committee and the legislative commission. For the purposes of]
- 7. As used in this section, "employee benefits" includes any form of compensation provided to a state employee pursuant to this Title except federal benefits, wages earned, legal holidays, deferred compensation and benefits available pursuant to chapter 286 of NRS.
- Sec. 10. 1. This section and sections 4 and 5 of this act become effective on July 1, 1999.
- 2. Sections 1, 2, 3 and 6 to 9, inclusive, of this act become effective on January 1, 2000.

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
