AN ACT relating to peace officers; requiring a peace officer to reimburse his state employer for the cost of training at a law enforcement training academy under certain circumstances; authorizing a state employer of a peace officer to recover the cost of training from the paycheck of an employee under certain circumstances; requiring the personnel commission of the department of personnel to adopt certain regulations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 289 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 3 1. A state employee who:
  - (a) Attends training for initial certification as a category I peace
- officer at a law enforcement training academy at the expense of his state employer; and
- (b) Resigns from state employment within 2 years after graduating from the academy.
- 9 shall reimburse his employer for the cost of the training.
- 10 2. An employer who is entitled to reimbursement pursuant to
- subsection 1 may deduct the cost of the training from the unencumbered
- 12 portion of the final paychecks of the employee. If the unencumbered
- amount of the final paychecks of the employee is insufficient to
- 14 reimburse the employer in full, the employer may obtain a writ of

attachment or garnishment against the property or wages of the employee pursuant to NRS 31.010 to 31.460, inclusive, to the extent 3 necessary to reimburse the employer in full for the cost of the training.

The personnel commission of the department of personnel, in cooperation with the director of the budget division of the department of administration, shall adopt regulations which:

(a) Define "law enforcement training academy" for the purposes of this section. The definition must include, without limitation:

- (1) An academy which provides training required for certification as a peace officer pursuant to the standards established by the peace officers' standards and training committee; and
- (2) An academy which provides training required for appointment as an officer of the Nevada highway patrol; and
  - (b) Determine the direct cost to a state agency of the training at each such academy and set forth the amount of reimbursement required in each circumstance pursuant to this section.
  - 4. As used in this section, "category I peace officer" means a person within the first training category established by the peace officers' standards and training committee or a similar category established by another law enforcement academy for peace officers who are empowered by law to perform a broad spectrum of law enforcement duties and whose primary functions specifically include:
- (a) Routine patrol; 23

- (b) Criminal investigations;
- (c) Enforcement of traffic laws; and
- (d) Investigation of motor vehicle accidents. 26
- **Sec. 2.** 1. The personnel commission of the department of personnel 27 shall adopt the regulations required pursuant to section 1 of this act on or before November 1, 1999.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1 of this act, the required 30 reimbursement does not apply to a state employee who begins training at a 31 law enforcement training academy before January 1, 2000. 32
- **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval. 33
