WHEREAS, The Inner-City Games began in Los Angeles in 1991 in

response to the growing problems facing inner-city youth, with Arnold

3 Schwarzenegger as the founder and Chairman; and

WHEREAS, In 1996, Las Vegas joined 11 other cities nationwide by

5 founding the Greater Las Vegas Inner-City Games; and

WHEREAS, The Greater Las Vegas Inner-City Games has been

supported solely by private sponsorships of cash or in-kind contributions;

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the state general fund to

Clark County the sum of \$250,000 for distribution to the nonprofit

9 organization Greater Las Vegas Inner-City Games for the continuation of

sports, educational and cultural activities in the Greater Las Vegas area.

- Sec. 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2001, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.

- **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
