## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 655-COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

## MARCH 22, 1999

## Referred to Committee on Ways and Means

SUMMARY—Makes appropriations for statewide automated system of information concerning pupils. (BDR S-1684)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.

AN ACT relating to education; extending the prospective expiration of the advisory committee for the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils; revising provisions governing the payment of the expenses of the members of the advisory committee; making appropriations to the Department of Education for the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Section 4 of chapter 333, Statutes of Nevada 1997, at page 1229, is hereby amended to read as follows:

  Sec. 4. 1. There is hereby created an advisory committee for the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils.

  The advisory committee consists of:

  (a) Representatives of school districts. The board of trustees of each school district shall each appoint one representative.
  - (b) Two representatives of the state board of education, appointed by the president of the board.
  - (c) One representative of the budget division of the department of administration, appointed by the chief of the budget division.
  - (d) Two members of the legislature. One of the members must be appointed by the majority leader of the senate and one of the members must be appointed by the speaker of the assembly.

2. The term of each member of the advisory committee commences on August 1, 1997, and expires on June 30, [1999.] 2001.

- 3. For each day or portion of a day during which a member of the advisory committee who is a legislator attends a meeting of the advisory committee or is otherwise engaged in the business of the advisory committee, except during a regular or special session of the legislature, he is entitled to receive the:
- (a) Compensation provided for a majority of the members of the legislature during the first 60 days of the preceding session;
- (b) Per diem allowance provided for state officers and employees generally; and
- (c) Travel expenses provided pursuant to NRS 218.2207. The compensation, per diem allowances and travel expenses of the legislative members of the advisory committee must be paid from the legislative fund.
- 4. The members of the advisory committee who are not legislators serve without compensation, except that for each day or portion of a day during which a member of the advisory committee attends a meeting of the advisory committee or is otherwise engaged in the work of the advisory committee, he is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally.
- [4.] 5. The superintendent of public instruction shall hold at least eight meetings with the advisory committee and during those meetings report to and consider any suggestions of the advisory committee concerning the establishment and maintenance of the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils.
- **Sec. 2.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the state general fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$10,691,280 for the establishment and maintenance of a statewide automated system of information concerning pupils pursuant to NRS 386.650.
- 2. The appropriation made by subsection 1 must be used in accordance with the programs established by each school district for the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils pursuant to NRS 386.650 in the following manner:
- (a) A sum not to exceed \$960,000 may be used by the Department of Education for:
- (1) Contractual services that are necessary to plan, install and evaluate hardware and software and provide technical assistance for the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils; and

- (2) The payment of the per diem allowances and travel expenses for the members of the advisory committee for the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils who are not legislators.
- (b) The remaining balance of the appropriation must be distributed to the Clark County School District for the purchase of hardware, networking and software for information relating to pupils, and training and other related services that are nonrecurring, including, without limitation, assistance in the integration of the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils.
- 3. To receive money pursuant to subsection 2, the board of trustees of the Clark County School District shall enter into a written agreement with the Department of Education. The written agreement must prescribe the duties of the school district and the Department of Education in establishing and maintaining the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils. The Clark County School District shall not use the money to:

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- (a) Settle or arbitrate disputes or negotiate settlements between an organization that represents employees of the school district and the school district; or
- (b) Adjust the schedules of salaries and benefits of the employees of the school district, excluding any overtime costs incurred by an employee of the school district while working on the establishment and maintenance of the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils.
- 4. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2001, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
- **Sec. 3.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the state general fund to the Department of Education the sum of \$4,088,802.
- 2. The Department of Education shall distribute the appropriation made by subsection 1 to all school districts, excluding the Clark County School District, for the ongoing costs of maintenance associated with the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils.
- 3. To receive money pursuant to subsection 2, the board of trustees of a school district shall enter into a written agreement with the Department of Education. The written agreement must prescribe the duties of the school district and the Department of Education in maintaining the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils. A school district shall not use the money to:
- 40 (a) Settle or arbitrate disputes or negotiate settlements between an 41 organization that represents employees of the school district and the school 42 district; or

- (b) Adjust the schedules of salaries and benefits of the employees of the school district, excluding any overtime costs incurred by an employee of the school district while working on the maintenance of the statewide automated system of information concerning pupils.
  - 4. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2001, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
- 9 **Sec. 4.** 1. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall report semiannually during the 1999-2001 biennium to the interim finance committee concerning the expenditures described in sections 2 and 3 of this act.
- 13 2. The Department of Education shall, on or before February 15, 2001, report to the 71st session of the Nevada Legislature on all expenditures described in sections 2 and 3 of this act.
- Sec. 5. For the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this act, the Department of Education is not subject to the provisions of chapter 233F or 242 of NRS.
- 19 **Sec. 6.** 1. This section and sections 2 and 3 of this act become 20 effective upon passage and approval.
- 2. Sections 1, 4 and 5 of this act become effective on July 1, 1999.

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
