SUMMARY—Directs Legislative Commission to conduct interim study of residential facilities for elderly persons. (BDR R-1605)

ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of residential facilities for elderly persons.

- 1 WHEREAS, Elderly persons living on fixed incomes compose a
2 significant portion of the population of the State of Nevada; and
3 WHEREAS, Many elderly persons cannot afford or are not able to
4 maintain a private home and must seek living arrangements in residential
5 facilities for groups; and
6 WHEREAS, Additional information is required to ensure that elderly
7 persons living in residential facilities for groups are treated with respect
8 and provided with the appropriate care required to maintain their health
9 and self-respect; now, therefore, be it
10 RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE
11 CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to
12 conduct an interim study concerning the quality of care provided to elderly
13 persons living in residential facilities for groups; and be it further
14 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall appoint a
15 subcommittee to conduct the study which must include an analysis of:
16 1. The regulations imposed on residential facilities for groups that
17 provide housing for elderly persons;
18 2. The fees charged at such facilities;
19 3. The information disclosed to elderly persons or their families
20 relating to the care to be provided; and

1 4. The special provisions, if any, that are provided for elderly persons
2 suffering from Alzheimer's Disease; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the
4 subcommittee must be approved by a majority of the members of the
5 Senate and a majority of the members of the Assembly appointed to the
6 subcommittee; and be it further

7 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall submit a report of its
8 findings and any recommendations for legislation to the 71st session of the
9 Nevada Legislature.

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
