ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the feasibility and desirability of a statewide health insurance program for residents who are not otherwise able to secure health insurance.

- WHEREAS, According to the Bureau of the Census of the United States
- Department of Commerce, in 1996, 255,000 residents of the State of
- 3 Nevada, which equaled 15.6 percent of the population of this state, were
- 4 not covered by health insurance; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Forty-one states provide some form of health insurance
- 6 specifically for residents who are not otherwise able to secure health
- 7 insurance; and
- WHEREAS, High-risk insurance may alleviate some of the financial
- 9 burden placed on families as a result of subsequent medical expenses; and
- WHEREAS, Although a limited number of high-risk individuals may be
- eligible for medical coverage pursuant to the provisions of the federal
- Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, the State of
- 13 Nevada does not guarantee that all high-risk individuals receive health
- 14 insurance; and
- WHEREAS, It is in the best interests of the residents of the State of
- 16 Nevada to explore the feasibility of a comprehensive statewide health

insurance program designed to assist those residents who are not otherwise

able to secure health insurance, to obtain a greater understanding of the

issues and problems of improving health care and to establish a unified

effort to improve access to health care in this state; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE

CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to

conduct an interim study concerning the desirability and feasibility of a

comprehensive statewide health insurance program to assist Nevadans who

cannot obtain health insurance coverage or who have suffered a

10 catastrophic illness; and be it further

11 RESOLVED, That the study must include, without limitation, an assessment of:

- 13 1. The estimated need for a comprehensive statewide health insurance program;
- 2. The number of residents in this state who would benefit from such a program and the logistics of making such a program available to these persons;
 - 3. The affordability of such a program, including exploring alternative sources of funding;
 - 4. The comprehensive health insurance policies and plans of various other states, including any studies that have been performed regarding these types of programs and the success rates of such programs;
 - 5. Strategies and systems for increasing the availability and affordability of such programs to residents of this state who are otherwise not able to secure health insurance;
 - 6. The availability of health insurance coverage available in this state or from the Federal Government which is not being utilized; and
 - 7. Any other issues that the committee wishes to study relating to the feasibility and logistics of implementing a statewide health insurance program for the residents of this state who are not otherwise able to secure health insurance or have suffered catastrophic illnesses; and be it further
 - RESOLVED, That any recommended legislation proposed by the committee must be approved by a majority of the members of the
- Assembly and a majority of the members of the Senate appointed to the

35 committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall submit a report of its findings and any recommendations for legislation to the 71st session of the

88 Nevada Legislature.
