SUMMARY—Directs Legislative Commission to conduct interim study of availability of health care in rural areas of this state. (BDR R-1695)

ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the availability of health care in the rural areas of this state.

- WHEREAS, Of the 17 counties that comprise the State of Nevada, 15
- counties have populations of less than 100,000 residents; and
- 3 WHEREAS, These rural counties in Nevada have a shortage of hospitals,
- 4 clinical facilities, qualified doctors and nurses, laboratory and medical
- 5 equipment, emergency medical systems, ambulances and aircraft for
- 6 medical transportation and on-going educational programs that provide
- 7 information on the availability of health services; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States narrowly addressed the
- 9 health care needs of residents living in sparsely populated rural areas in the
- 10 Balanced Budget Act of 1997, and, thus, it is the responsibility of the State
- of Nevada to ensure that the needs of these residents be addressed; now,
- 12 therefore, be it

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- 13 RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE
- 14 CONCURRING, That the Legislative Commission is hereby directed to
- conduct an interim study of the availability of health care in the rural areas
- of this state including a review of:
 - 1. The plans, if any, to improve and integrate emergency medical
- services in rural areas:
- 19 2. The availability, accessibility and quality of facilities providing
- 20 long-term care;
- 3. Issues relating to the use of "telemedicine" in areas with a critical
- shortage of access to medical facilities:

- 4. The availability of personnel with technical skills and resources to 1 assist in determining the financial feasibility of local hospitals; 2
- 5. The efforts made in recruiting and retaining qualified professionals 3 in health care services; 4
- The success of rural providers of medical care in acquiring the latest 5 medical and laboratory equipment;
- 7. The development of programs that educate residents in rural areas about the availability of health services; and 8
- The availability of transportation in rural areas, including 9 accessibility to helicopters and ambulances, when necessary, to travel long 10 distances to medical care; and be it further 11
- RESOLVED, That no action may be taken by the study committee on 12 recommended legislation unless it receives a majority vote of the Senators 13 on the committee and a majority vote of the Assemblymen on the
- committee; and be it further 15
- RESOLVED, That the Legislative Commission shall report the findings of 16
- the study and any recommendations for legislation to the 71st session of the 17
- Nevada Legislature.
