# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 244 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. The board of county commissioners of a county whose population is 400,000 or more shall enact an ordinance requiring the customer of a
- public utility who is provided with paging equipment and subleases or
- 6 otherwise makes the equipment available for use by another person in
- 7 that county to maintain such records of the names and addresses of the

- 8 person to whom the equipment is so provided as the board deems

- 2. The ordinance must include:
- 11 (a) The information that must be included in the records required to

- 13 (b) The length of time the records must be maintained by the customer
