SUMMARY—Requires certain counties to establish requirements for maintenance of records relating to users of paging equipment. (BDR 20-578)

AN ACT relating to counties; requiring certain counties to establish requirements for the maintenance of records relating to users of paging equipment; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE
AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** Chapter 244 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a
2 new section to read as follows:
3 ***1. The board of county commissioners of a county whose population***
4 ***is 400,000 or more shall enact an ordinance requiring the customer of a***
5 ***public utility who is provided with paging equipment and subleases or***
6 ***otherwise makes the equipment available for use by another person in***
7 ***that county to maintain such records of the names and addresses of the***
8 ***person to whom the equipment is so provided as the board deems***
9 ***necessary.***
10 ***2. The ordinance must include:***
11 ***(a) The information that must be included in the records required to***
12 ***be maintained; and***
13 ***(b) The length of time the records must be maintained by the customer***
14 ***of the public utility.***

1 ***3. As used in this section, “public utility” has the meaning ascribed***
2 ***to it in NRS 704.020.***

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
