AN ACT making an appropriation to “Kids Count” for determination of the programs for children that lack funding; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

- 1 WHEREAS, Identifying the educational needs of children in this state is

- 3 essential to ensure that the children receive the best possible education; and
- 4 WHEREAS, To ensure that successful educational programs for children
- 5 continue to be available, it is necessary to develop priorities for funding
- 6 these programs based on the current educational needs of the children in
- 7 this state; and
- 8 WHEREAS, “Kids Count” is an organization that conducts research and
- 9 compiles statistics relating to the available programs for children and sets
- 10 priorities for funding such programs based on their findings; now,
- 11 therefore,

- 13 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
- 14 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 16 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the state general fund to
- 17 “Kids Count” for development of statistics to determine priorities for
- 18 funding programs for children:
- 19 For the fiscal year 1999-2000.....\$50,000
- 20 For the fiscal year 2000-2001.....\$100,000
- 21 **Sec. 2.** Any balance of the sums appropriated by section 1 of this act
- 22 remaining at the end of the respective fiscal years must not be committed

1 for expenditure after June 30 of the respective fiscal years and reverts to the
2 state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been
3 made.

4 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
