SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing closure of highways, bridges, roads and streets for construction, maintenance or repair in certain counties. (BDR 35-1241)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to highways; prohibiting, under certain circumstances, the closure of highways, roads, streets or bridges for construction, maintenance or repair in certain counties; requiring a contract that is made or awarded by the department of transportation for the construction, improvement, maintenance or repair of a highway to include a provision for the payment of an additional amount of money if the construction, improvement, maintenance or repair is completed before a certain date; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 403 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- During the period from December 1 to January 2, inclusive, a board of
- 4 county highway commissioners, a board of road commissioners or a
- 5 county road supervisor in a county whose population is 100,000 or more
- 6 shall not close a public highway, road or bridge to construct, maintain or
- repair that highway, road or bridge unless the closure is necessary to
- 8 protect:
 - 1. The public; or
- 10 2. The highway, road or bridge from damage during a storm.

- Sec. 2. NRS 403.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 403.090 [The] Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act, 2 the board of county highway commissioners [shall have] has exclusive control of all matters [pertaining] relating to the construction, repairing and maintaining of public highways, roads and bridges within its county.
 - **Sec. 3.** NRS 403.140 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 403.140 1. [Under] Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act, under the direction of the board of county highway commissioners, the county road supervisor shall:
 - (a) Take charge of all county roads.

- (b) Supervise and direct the building, repairing and maintaining of all 11 county roads. 12
 - (c) Lay out roads on the best grades and alignments possible.
- (d) Repair, plan and supervise and furnish estimates for the guidance of 14 the board of county highway commissioners. 15
 - (e) Perform such other duties as the board of county highway commissioners may direct and as are required by this chapter.
- The county road supervisor shall view every county road within his 18 county at least once each year. 19
 - **Sec. 4.** NRS 403.160 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 1. If the board of county highway commissioners [shall 21 decide determines not to appoint a county road supervisor for the county, the board may [, at its option,] create a board of road commissioners for each district. The board of road commissioners [shall] must consist of one to three members. 25
- The boundaries of the districts may be fixed by the board of county 26 highway commissioners, and road commissioners may be elected in the same manner as [in the case of] township officers.
- 29 Road commissioners shall hold office until their successors are [duly] elected or appointed, and qualified, and shall take and subscribe to 30 the constitutional oath of office before entering upon their duties. 31
- [A] Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act, a board of 32 road commissioners [shall: 33
- 34 (a) Exercise :
 - (a) Shall exercise the duties of the county road supervisor.
- 36 (b) [Have] Has supervision over all road work within its district, and may appoint whomever the board may choose to do the work. 37
- 38 All vouchers [shall] must be signed by at least a majority of the road commissioners and allowed as in the usual course of claims against the county, but [no] a board of road commissioners [shall] may not contract for any amount of work in excess of the [funds] money set aside for [such] the

- district by the board of county commissioners unless in case of an emergency when, by order of the board of county commissioners, a larger
- amount may be expended.
- 6. The board of county commissioners shall set aside for each road district the [sums of] money apportioned for each road district at the first meeting of the board in January, or as soon thereafter as possible.
- Sec. 5. NRS 404.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 404.150 [Each]
- 9 *1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, each* road supervisor appointed under the provisions of NRS 404.120 to 404.160, inclusive, shall:

- (b) Attest to the propriety and correctness of all bills for [such work. 3] that work; and
 - (c) Direct the expenditures of all sums set apart for his road district by the board of county commissioners, [but no bills shall] except that no bill may be contracted or any money expended by the road supervisor unless he [shall have first obtained] obtains the consent and approval of the board of county commissioners.
 - 2. During the period from December 1 to January 2, inclusive, a road supervisor in a county whose population is 100,000 or more shall not close a road in his district to construct, maintain or repair that road unless the closure is necessary to protect:
 - (a) The public; or

- (b) The road from damage during a storm.
- Sec. 6. Chapter 408 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 7 and 8 of this act.
- Sec. 7. 1. Any contract made or awarded by the department for the construction, improvement, maintenance or repair of a highway or an appurtenance to that highway that is located in a county whose population is 100,000 or more must include a provision for the payment of an additional amount of money to the person with whom the contract is made or to whom it is awarded if he satisfactorily completes the construction, improvement, maintenance or repair of the highway or appurtenance before the date for completion of that construction, improvement, maintenance or repair set forth in the contract.
- 2. The amount of money to be paid pursuant to a provision included in a contract specified in subsection 1 and the date before which the work must be completed must be determined by the department.

- Sec. 8. During the period from December 1 to January 2, inclusive, the director shall not close a highway that is located in a county whose population is 100,000 or more to construct, reconstruct, improve or maintain that highway unless the closure is necessary to protect:
 - 1. The public; or

- 2. The highway from damage during a storm.
- **Sec. 9.** NRS 408.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 8 408.210 1. [The] Except as otherwise provided in section 8 of this 9 act, the director may restrict the use of, or close, any highway [whenever] if 10 he considers the closing or restriction of use necessary:
 - (a) [For the protection of] To protect the public.
- 12 (b) [For the protection of such] *To protect the* highway from damage during [storms] *a storm* or during construction, reconstruction, improvement or maintenance operations thereon.
- 15 (c) To promote economic development or tourism in the best interest of 16 the state or upon the written request of the executive director of the 17 commission on economic development or the commission on tourism.
 - 2. The director may:
 - (a) Divide or separate any highway into separate roadways, wherever there is particular danger to the traveling public of collisions between vehicles proceeding in opposite directions or from vehicular turning movements or cross-traffic, by constructing curbs, central dividing sections or other physical dividing lines, or by signs, marks or other devices in or on the highway appropriate to designate the dividing line.
 - (b) Lay out and construct frontage roads on and along any highway or freeway and divide and separate any such frontage road from the main highway or freeway by means of curbs, physical barriers or by other appropriate devices.
- 29 The director may remove from the highways any unlicensed encroachment which is not removed, or the removal of which is not 30 commenced and thereafter diligently prosecuted, within 5 days after 31 personal service of notice and demand upon the owner of the encroachment 32 or his agent. In lieu of personal service upon that person or his agent, 33 34 service of the notice may [also] be made by registered or certified mail and by posting, for a period of 5 days, a copy of the notice on the encroachment 35 described in the notice. Removal by the department of the encroachment on the failure of the owner to comply with the notice and demand gives the 37 38 department a right of action to recover the expense of the removal, cost and expenses of suit, and in addition thereto the sum of \$100 for each day the 39 encroachment remains beyond 5 days after the service of the notice and 40 demand. 41
- 42 4. If the director determines that the interests of the department are not compromised by a proposed or existing encroachment, he may issue a

- license to the owner or his agent permitting an encroachment on the
- highway. [Such a] The license is revocable and must provide for relocation
- or removal of the encroachment in the following manner. Upon notice from
- the director to the owner of the encroachment or his agent, the owner or
- agent may propose a [time] period within which he will relocate or remove
- the encroachment as required. If the director and the owner or his agent
- agree upon [such a time,] that period, the director shall not himself remove
- the encroachment unless the owner or his agent has failed to do so within
- the [time] period agreed. If the director and the owner or his agent do not
- agree upon [such a time,] that period, the director may remove the 10
- encroachment at any time later than 30 days after the service of the original 11
- notice upon the owner or his agent. Service of notice may be made in the 12
- manner provided by subsection 3. Removal of the encroachment by the 13
- director gives the department the right of action provided by subsection 3, 14
- but the penalty must be computed from the expiration of the agreed period 15 16

or 30-day period. [, as the case may be.]

- During the period from December 1 to January 2, inclusive, the city 35

- shall not close a street or other public right of way to improve, equip or 37
- maintain that street or other public right of way unless the closure is necessary to protect: 39
- The public; or 40 1.
- The street or other public right of way from damage during a 2. 41 42 storm.

- Sec. 12. NRS 266.261 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 266.261 1. [The] Except as otherwise provided in section 11 of this
- act, the city council, on behalf of the city and in its name, without any
- election, may acquire, improve, equip, operate and maintain, convert to orauthorize:
- 6 (a) Curb and gutter projects;
- 7 (b) Drainage projects;
- 8 (c) Offstreet parking projects;
- 9 (d) Overpass projects;
- 10 (e) Park projects;
- 11 (f) Sanitary sewer projects;
- 12 (g) Sidewalk projects;

 - (a) The distribution and exhibition of handbills, or signs.

- 5. Prevent riots or any act tending to promote riots in any public place.
- Sec. 14. NRS 269.185 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (b) Regulate the speed, parking, stopping, turning and operation of all motor vehicles and other vehicles using the streets and alleys.

- Sec. 15. The amendatory provisions of this act expire by limitation on October 1, 2009.
