## SENATE BILL NO. 246-SENATOR SHAFFER

## FEBRUARY 23, 1999

## Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

SUMMARY—Authorizes board of dental examiners of Nevada to issue limited number of licenses without examination each year to dentists licensed in other jurisdictions. (BDR 54-1191)

AN ACT relating to dentistry; authorizing the board of dental examiners of Nevada to issue a limited number of licenses each year to dentists licensed in other jurisdictions; establishing the fee for an application for a license to practice dentistry without examination; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 631 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the board may, without examination, issue a license to practice dentistry to a person

- (a) Holds a license to practice dentistry in another state, a territory or possession of the United States or the District of Columbia whose
- 8 requirements for licensing at the time the license was issued are deemed
- 9 by the board to be substantially equivalent to the requirements for a
- 10 license to practice dentistry set forth in this chapter;
- 11 (b) Pays the fee prescribed by NRS 631.345; and
- (c) Submits the statement required by NRS 631.225.
- 2. The board shall not issue a license pursuant to this section to:
- 14 (a) More than 20 persons each year;
- (b) An applicant who has been refused a license in this state, another
- state, a possession or territory of the United States or the District of
- 17 Columbia; or

- (c) An applicant whose license to practice dentistry has been revoked in this state, another state, a possession or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia.
- 3. The board shall adopt regulations that prescribe the procedure for the allocation of licenses issued pursuant to this section.
  - **Sec. 2.** NRS 631.240 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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- 631.240 Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act:
- 1. [Any person desiring to obtain] Each applicant for a license to practice dentistry in this state, after having complied with the regulations of the board to determine eligibility, must:
- (a) Present to the board a certificate granted by the National Board of Dental Examiners which contains a notation that he has passed the board's examination with an average score of at least 75; and
  - (b) Be examined by the board on his practical knowledge of dentistry.
- 2. The board shall examine each applicant in writing on the contents and interpretation of chapter 631 of NRS and the regulations of the board.
- 3. The examination must include clinical demonstrations of the applicant's skill in dentistry.
- 4. All persons who present the appropriate certificate and successfully complete the examination must be registered as licensed dentists on the board register, as provided in this chapter, and are entitled to receive a certificate of registration, signed by the member of the board who is a representative of the general public and those members of the board who are dentists.
- **Sec. 3.** NRS 631.345 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 631.345 1. The fees which must be charged by the board for the performance of the duties imposed upon it by this chapter are as follows:

- 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the board shall charge a fee to review a course of continuing education for accreditation. The fee must not exceed \$150 per credit hour of the proposed course. The board shall not charge a nonprofit organization or an agency of the state or of a political subdivision of the state a fee to review a course of continuing education.
- 3. All fees prescribed in this section are payable in advance and must not be refunded.
  - **Sec. 4.** Section 1 of this act is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 1. 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the board may, without examination, issue a license to practice dentistry to a person who:
    - (a) Holds a license to practice dentistry in another state, a territory or possession of the United States or the District of Columbia whose requirements for licensing at the time the license was issued are deemed by the board to be substantially equivalent to the requirements for a license to practice dentistry set forth in this chapter; *and* 
      - (b) Pays the fee prescribed by NRS 631.345. [; and
    - (c) Submits the statement required by NRS 631.225.]
    - 2. The board shall not issue a license pursuant to this section to:
    - (a) More than 20 persons each year;
    - (b) An applicant who has been refused a license in this state, another state, a possession or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia; or
    - (c) An applicant whose license to practice dentistry has been revoked in this state, another state, a possession or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia.
    - 3. The board shall adopt regulations that prescribe the procedure for the allocation of licenses issued pursuant to this section.
- Sec. 5. 1. This section and sections 1, 2 and 3 of this act become effective on October 1, 1999.

- 2. Section 4 of this act becomes effective on the date on which the provisions of 42 U.S.C. § 666 requiring each state to establish procedures under which the state has authority to withhold or suspend, or to restrict the use of professional, occupational and recreational licenses of persons who:
- (a) Have failed to comply with a subpoena or warrant relating to a procedure to determine the paternity of a child or to establish or enforce an obligation for the support of a child; or
- 8 (b) Are in arrears in the payment for the support of one or more 9 children,

are repealed by the Congress of the United States.

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
