AN ACT relating to crimes; prohibiting hazing at colleges and universities in this state; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 200 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 3 1. A person who engages or conspires to engage in hazing is guilty 4 of:
- 5 (a) A misdemeanor, if no substantial bodily harm results.
- 6 (b) A gross misdemeanor, if substantial bodily harm results.
- 7 2. Consent of a victim of hazing is not a valid defense to a prosecution conducted pursuant to this section.
- 9 3. As used in this section, "hazing" means any method of initiation
- into a student organization at a college or university in this state or any
- other conduct engaged in by a member of a student organization at a
- 12 college or university in this state that intentionally or recklessly
- 13 endangers the mental or physical health of another person. The term
- 14 includes, without limitation:
- 15 (a) Any physical brutality, such as whipping, beating, branding,
- 16 forced calisthenics, exposure to the elements, forced consumption of
- 17 food, liquor, drugs or other substances, or any other brutal treatment or
- 18 forced physical activity that is likely to adversely affect the physical
- 19 health of the person; and

- (b) Any activity that subjects the person to extreme mental stress, such as sleep deprivation, forced exclusion from social contact, forced conduct that is likely to result in extreme embarrassment, or any other forced activity that is likely to adversely affect the mental health or dignity of the person.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses 7 that were committed before October 1, 1999.
