# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated to the Department of

- 1. State general fund, the sum of \$88,767; and
- 2. State highway fund, the sum of \$3,690,770,
- 5 for the completion of Phase III of the Integrated Financial Management
- 6 System. These appropriations are supplemental to the appropriations made
- 7 by section 1 of chapter 648, Statutes of Nevada 1997, at page 3227.
- 8 **Sec. 2.** 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of
- 9 Administration from the:
  - (a) State general fund, the sum of \$10,550,242; and
- (b) State highway fund, the sum of \$5,619,795,
- 12 for the continued development and implementation of the Integrated
- 13 Financial Management System.

- 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2001, and reverts to
- the state general fund and the state highway fund, respectively, as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
- Sec. 3. 1. Section 1 of this act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
- 2. Section 2 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.
