SENATE BILL NO. 310-SENATORS RHOADS, McGINNESS, JACOBSEN AND AMODEL

MARCH 3, 1999

SUMMARY—Creates rangeland resources commission. (BDR 50-1419)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State or on Industrial Insurance: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to livestock; creating the rangeland resources commission; providing for its membership; prescribing its powers and duties; imposing a fee for each animal unit month used by a cow or sheep on grazing lands under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 563 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto
- 2 the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act.
- Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act, unless the
- context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 to
- 6, inclusive, of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those
- 6 sections.
- Sec. 3. "Commission" means the rangeland resources commission
- created by section 7 of this act.
- Sec. 4. "Grazing lands" means any public lands in this state:
- That are managed or controlled by the United States Forest 10
- Service or the Bureau of Land Management; and 11
- Upon which a person herds or grazes cattle or sheep pursuant to a 12
- 13 license, lease or permit issued for that purpose by the Secretary of
- 14 Agriculture or the Secretary of the Interior.

- "Livestock industry" includes, without limitation, the control, management and use of grazing lands.
- Sec. 6. "State grazing board" means a state grazing board created by the provisions of NRS 568.040.
- Sec. 7. 1. The rangeland resources commission is hereby created. The commission consists of:
 - (a) One member from each state grazing board;

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- (b) The president of the Nevada Cattlemen's Association or its successor organization; and
- (c) The president of the Nevada Woolgrowers' Association or its 10 successor organization. 11
- The president of the Nevada Cattlemen's Association or its successor 13 organization and the president of the Nevada Woolgrowers' Association or its successor organization serve as ex officio members of the commission. 15
- 2. Not less than 30 days before the expiration of the term of a member of the commission, the state grazing board from which the member was appointed shall submit to the governor a written list of two persons for appointment to the commission. A person nominated by a state grazing board must be a member of that board. If such a list is submitted to the governor by a state grazing board within the period 22 prescribed in this subsection, the governor shall appoint to the commission one member from the list. If the list is not submitted to the governor by a state grazing board within that period, the governor shall appoint to the commission one member who is a member of that board.
- The members of the commission shall elect a chairman and vice 26 chairman by a majority vote. After the initial election, the chairman and 27 vice chairman serve in that office for a term of 1 year beginning on July 1 of each year. If a vacancy occurs in the chairmanship, the members of the commission shall elect a chairman from among its members to serve the remainder of the unexpired term. 31
- After the initial terms, each member of the commission who is 32 appointed serves for a term of 4 years. 33
- 5. A vacancy on the commission must be filled in the same manner 34 as the original appointment. 35
 - Each member of the commission:
 - (a) Serves without compensation; and
- (b) While engaged in the business of the commission, is entitled to 38 receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally. 40
- If the commission receives any fees specified in section 13 of this 41 act, the per diem allowance and travel expenses of a member of the commission must be paid from those fees. If the fees are insufficient to

- 1 pay the per diem allowance and travel expenses of the member, the
- 2 commission shall determine the amount of the per diem allowance and
- 3 travel expenses that is not paid from the fees. After making that
- 4 determination, the commission shall provide a written notice of the 5 amount to:
- (a) The Nevada Cattlemen's Association or its successor organization, if the member is the president of that association or successor organization;
- (b) The Nevada Woolgrowers' Association or its successor organization, if the member is the president of that association or 11 organization; or
- (c) The state grazing board from which the member was appointed, if 12 13 the member is appointed from a state grazing board.
- 14 Upon receipt of the notice, the association or successor organization or 15 the state grazing board shall pay to the commission the amount specified

16 in the notice.

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- Sec. 8. 1. The members of the commission shall meet at least 18 quarterly and at the times and places specified by a call of the chairman or by a majority of the members of the commission.
- 2. A majority of the members of the commission constitute a 20 21 quorum, and a quorum may exercise all the powers and duties of the 22 commission.
 - **Sec. 9.** The commission may:
 - 1. Conduct research and surveys to determine the opinions and knowledge of the residents of this state concerning the livestock industry;
- 25 2. Establish programs to provide information to the residents of this 26 state concerning the livestock industry; 27
- Conduct advertising campaigns to promote the livestock industry; 28
- 29 Support the responsible control, management or use of grazing *4*. 30 lands;
- Compile information concerning the livestock industry and 31 32 disseminate that information to each state grazing board;
- 6. Make determinations concerning: 33
 - (a) The availability of forage on grazing lands; or
- (b) The emergence of new markets or the expansion of existing 35 markets in the livestock industry; and
- 7. Take any action it determines is necessary to stabilize or protect 37 38 the livestock industry.
- Sec. 10. The commission may: 39
- Cooperate with any local, state or federal agency or any local, 40
- 41 state or national organization whose duties and powers are the same as
- or similar to the duties and powers of the commission;

- Employ such persons or enter into such contracts as it determines are necessary to assist it in carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act;
 - Grant, donate or expend money:

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- (a) To construct or maintain a range improvement; or 5
 - (b) For any other purpose beneficial to the livestock industry; and
 - 4. Purchase, lease or own any real or personal property.
- **Sec. 11.** The commission may sue and be sued in any court. A member or employee of the commission is not personally liable for actions that are taken within the scope of the powers and duties of the commission pursuant to the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act. 12
 - Sec. 12. 1. The commission may apply for or accept any gifts, grants, donations or contributions from any source to assist it in carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act.
- 2. Any money the commission receives pursuant to subsection 1 must 16 be deposited in the state treasury pursuant to the provisions of section 14 18 of this act.
- Sec. 13. Not later than January 15 of each year, each person 19 who grazes cattle or sheep on grazing lands shall pay a fee of 10 cents for each animal unit month used by those cattle or sheep on those lands for the immediately preceding year, if the commission enters into an agreement with the United States Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management to provide for the collection of the fee by the United States Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management. If an agreement is 26 entered into pursuant to the provisions of this subsection, the agreement must specify: 27
 - (a) The manner in which the fee must be paid to:
 - (1) The United States Forest Service, if the person grazes cattle or sheep on grazing lands managed or controlled by the United States Forest Service; or
- (2) The Bureau of Land Management, if the person grazes cattle or 32 sheep on grazing lands managed or controlled by the Bureau of Land 33 34 Management; and
- (b) The period during which the United States Forest Service and the 35 Bureau of Land Management must report and remit to the commission the fees collected by the United States Forest Service and the Bureau of 37 Land Management pursuant to the agreement. 38
- 2. Any person who pays a fee to the United States Forest Service or 39 the Bureau of Land Management pursuant to the provisions of
- 41 subsection 1 may, not earlier than January 15 of each year and not later
- 42 than February 15 of that year, apply to the commission for a refund of
- 43 the fee paid for the immediately preceding year. The application must be

- submitted on a form prescribed by the commission. Upon receipt of the request and after determining that the fee has been paid by the person requesting the refund, the commission shall, within 60 days after making that determination, refund to that person an amount equal to the fee paid
- 3. As used in this section, "animal unit month" means the amount of forage required to sustain one cow or one sheep for 1 month.
- Sec. 14. 1. Any money the commission receives pursuant to sections 12 and 13 of this act:
- 10 (a) Must be deposited in the state treasury and accounted for 11 separately in the state general fund;
- (b) May be used by the commission only for the costs of carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act; and
- 14 (c) Does not revert to the state general fund at the end of any fiscal 15 year.
- 2. Any interest or income earned on the money in the account must be credited to the account. Any claims against the account must be paid in the manner that other claims against the state are paid.
- Sec. 15. 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 and section 7 of this act, any costs the commission incurs in carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act must be paid from the money deposited in the state treasury pursuant to the provisions of section 14 of this act.
- 24 2. If the amount of money deposited in the state treasury pursuant to section 14 of this act is insufficient to pay any cost incurred by the commission in carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act, the commission shall:
- 28 (a) Determine the amount of the cost that is not paid from that 29 money; and
- 30 (b) Divide that amount by the number of members who serve on the 31 commission on the date the determination is made by the commission 32 pursuant to paragraph (a).
- 33 3. After determining the amount of the cost pursuant to subsection 2, the commission shall provide a written notice of the amount to:
 - (a) The Nevada Cattlemen's Association or its successor organization;
- 36 (b) The Nevada Woolgrowers' Association or its successor 37 organization; and
- 38 (c) Each state grazing board.

5 by the person.

Upon receipt of the notice, the association or its successor organization and each state grazing board shall pay to the commission the amount specified in the notice.

- Sec. 16. The commission may adopt such regulations as are necessary to carry out the provisions of sections 2 to 16, inclusive, of this act.
 - **Sec. 17.** NRS 568.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 568.120 Each state grazing board may pay [moneys] money out of the range improvement fund of its grazing district:
- 1. For the construction and maintenance of range improvements or any other purpose beneficial to the stock raising and ranching industries and [, in turn,] the counties situated within the grazing district concerned. [None of the funds shall] *The money must not* be used for projects involving construction or maintenance [, or both,] of range improvements on public or state lands unless some legally constituted and authorized federal, state, county or city department, division, bureau, service, board or commission is available for and authorized and willing to undertake direct management and supervision of the project concerned.
- 2. For the payment of **[proper]** *the* administrative costs of the board, including travel expenses and subsistence allowances of its members, and for the payment of the services of its secretary and his necessary office expenses and for the services of its attorney.
- 3. For contributions to defray costs and expenses for activities and projects incurred under its written authorization by the central committee of Nevada state grazing boards as provided for under NRS 568.170 to 568.200, inclusive.
- 4. For any costs incurred by the rangeland resources commission created by section 7 of this act, if the state grazing board receives a notice from the commission for the payment of those costs pursuant to section 7 or 15 of this act.
- **Sec. 18.** 1. Not later than September 1, 1999, each state grazing board shall submit to the governor a written list of two persons for appointment to the rangeland resources commission created by section 7 of this act. Each person included in the list must be a member of the state grazing board that submits the list.
- 2. As soon as practicable after October 1, 1999, the appointed members of the rangeland resources commission must be appointed by the governor from the lists submitted pursuant to subsection 1 to initial terms as follows:
 - (a) Two members to terms that expire on October 1, 2000;
 - (b) Two members to terms that expire on October 1, 2001; and
- 39 (c) Three members to terms that expire on October 1, 2002.
- The governor shall not appoint more than one person from each list submitted pursuant to subsection 1.

- Sec. 19. The provisions of this act become effective on July 1, 1999, for the purpose of appointing the members of the rangeland resources commission created by section 7 of this act, and on October 1, 1999, for all other purposes.
