AN ACT relating to the labor commissioner; prohibiting the labor commissioner from appealing certain decisions of the district court; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 607 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 If, upon a petition for judicial review, a decision of the labor

4 commissioner is set aside in whole or in part by a district court on the

5 ground that substantial rights of the petitioner were prejudiced because

the decision of the labor commissioner was in violation of constitutional

7 or statutory provisions, the labor commissioner shall not appeal the

8 judgment of the district court to the supreme court.

- **Sec. 2.** NRS 233B.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 233B.150 [An] Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this act,
- an aggrieved party may obtain a review of any final judgment of the district
- court by appeal to the supreme court. The appeal [shall] must be taken as in
- 13 other civil cases.
- Sec. 3. NRS 412.1393 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 15 412.1393 1. Any member of the Nevada National Guard who
- believes his employment was terminated in violation of NRS 412.139 may.
- within 60 days after receiving a notice of termination, request a hearing
- before the labor commissioner to determine if his employment was so
- 19 terminated.

- 2. The office shall supply the member with all forms needed to request such a hearing. The labor commissioner shall conduct the hearing in the manner provided in NRS 607.205 to 607.220, inclusive [...], and section 1
- 4 of this act.
  5 Sec. 4. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
