AN ACT relating to hidden cameras; prohibiting the use of hidden cameras under certain circumstances; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 200 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
 - 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, it is unlawful for a person knowingly to photograph, videotape or otherwise film another person using a device that is purposely:
 - (a) Concealed from the view of the person being photographed, videotaped or otherwise filmed; or
 - (b) Disguised so as to avoid detection by the person being photographed, videotaped or otherwise filmed.
- 2. Subsection 1 does not apply to a person who photographs, videotapes or otherwise films another person if:
- (a) The other person consents to the filming; or
- 13 (b) The filming will be used exclusively:

- (1) To further a criminal investigation; or
- (2) For purposes of security or protection of persons or property.
- 3. A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a
- misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 per violation.

- Sec. 2. The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses that are committed before October 1, 1999.
