AN ACT relating to the state legislature; establishing a legislative committee on correctional institutions and providing its duties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Chapter 218 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this act.
- Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this act, "committee" means the legislative committee on correctional institutions.
- Sec. 3. 1. There is hereby established a legislative committee on correctional institutions consisting of six legislative members and five ex officio, nonvoting members. The membership of the committee consists of:
- 9 (a) Three members of the senate standing committee on finance, appointed by the majority leader of the senate;
- 11 (b) Three members of the assembly standing committee on ways and 12 means, appointed by the speaker of the assembly; and
- 13 (c) The following ex officio, nonvoting members:
- 14 (1) The director of the department of prisons or a person designated 15 by him;
- 16 (2) The medical director of the department of prisons or a person designated by him;

- (3) The director of the department of administration or a person designated by him;
- (4) The state forester firewarden, or a person designated by him who has responsibility within the division of forestry of the state department of conservation and natural resources for the program of conservation camps established pursuant to chapter 209 of NRS; and

(5) The assistant director for industrial programs within the department of prisons or a person designated by him.

- 9 2. The legislative members of the committee shall select a chairman from one house of the legislature and a vice chairman from the other.

  11 After the initial selection of a chairman and a vice chairman, each such officer shall hold office for a term of 2 years commencing on July 1 of each odd-numbered year. If a vacancy occurs in the chairmanship or vice chairmanship, the legislative members of the committee shall select a replacement for the remainder of the unexpired term.
  - 3. Any legislative member of the committee who is not a candidate for reelection or who is defeated for reelection continues to serve until the convening of the next regular session of the legislature.
- 19 4. Vacancies on the committee must be filled in the same manner as 20 original appointments.
- Sec. 4. 1. The members of the committee shall meet throughout each year at the times and places specified by a call of the chairman or a majority of the legislative members of the committee. The director of the legislative counsel bureau or a person he has designated shall act as the nonvoting recording secretary of the committee. Four legislative members of the committee constitute a quorum, and a quorum may exercise all the power and authority conferred on the committee.
  - 2. Except during a regular or special session of the legislature, the legislative members of the committee are entitled to receive the compensation provided for a majority of the members of the legislature during the first 60 days of the preceding regular session of the legislature, the per diem allowance provided for state officers and employees generally and the travel expenses provided pursuant to NRS 218.2207 for each day of attendance at a meeting of the committee and while engaged in the business of the committee. Per diem allowances, compensation and travel expenses of the legislative members of the committee must be paid from the legislative fund.
- 38 3. The ex officio, nonvoting members of the committee are entitled to receive the subsistence allowances and travel expenses provided by law for their respective positions for each day of attendance at a meeting of the committee and while engaged in the business of the committee, to be paid by the respective agencies by which they are employed.

### Sec. 5. The committee:

- 2 1. May review and comment on any program of the correctional institutions and conservation camps in this state;
- 2. Shall view the operations of the institutions and facilities of the department of prisons and such other correctional institutions and conservation camps as the committee deems necessary:
  - 3. May hold hearings in connection with its review;
- 8 4. May direct the legislative counsel bureau to assist in its research, 9 review and comment;
- 5. May recommend to the legislature as a result of its review any appropriate state legislation; and
- 12 6. May apply for any available grants and accept any gifts, grants or donations to aid the committee in carrying out its duties.
- Sec. 6. This act becomes effective on July 1, 1999.
