SUMMARY—Requires sheriff to notify spouse of person who applies for issuance or renewal of permit to carry concealed firearm or whose permit is revoked or restored. (BDR 15-824)

AN ACT relating to concealed firearms; requiring the sheriff to notify the spouse of a person that the person has applied for the issuance or renewal of a permit to carry a concealed firearm or that his permit has been revoked or restored; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY. DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** NRS 202.3662 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 202.3662 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section:
- (a) An application for a permit, and all information contained within that application; and
- 5 (b) All information provided to a sheriff or obtained by a sheriff in the
- 6 course of his investigation of an applicant,
- 7 are confidential.
 - 2. Any records regarding an applicant or permittee may be released to
- 9 a law enforcement agency for the purpose of conducting an investigation or prosecution.
- 3. Statistical abstracts of data compiled by a sheriff regarding permits
- applied for or issued pursuant to NRS 202.3653 to 202.369, inclusive,
- including, but not limited to, the number of applications received and
- 14 permits issued, may be released to any person.

- 1 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5, if a person who is 2 married:
 - (a) Applies for the issuance or renewal of a permit; or
 - (b) Has his permit revoked or restored,
- 5 not later than 2 days after the date the application is received or the
- 6 permit is revoked or restored by a sheriff, the sheriff shall send a notice
- 7 by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the spouse of that person at
- 8 the last known address of the spouse, indicating that the person has
- 9 applied for the issuance or renewal of a permit or that his permit has
- 10 been revoked or restored.
- 5. The provisions of subsection 4 do not apply to a person who is a
- 12 judge or a prosecuting attorney of an agency or political subdivision of
- 13 the United States or of this state.

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
