AN ACT relating to animals; requiring a veterinarian who knows or has reason to know that an animal has been tortured or subjected to cruelty to report that fact to a peace officer or officer of a society for the prevention of cruelty to animals; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 574 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. A veterinarian who, in his professional capacity, knows or has reason to know that an animal has been tortured or subjected to cruelty shall report
- 5 that fact to a peace officer or officer of a society for the prevention of
- 6 cruelty to animals who is authorized to make arrests pursuant to NRS
- 574.040. The report must be submitted not later than 24 hours after the
- 8 veterinarian knows or has reason to know of the torture of or cruelty to the 9 animal.
- 2. A veterinarian who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 12 3. As used in this section, "veterinarian" has the meaning ascribed to it 13 in NRS 574.330.
- Sec. 2. NRS 574.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 574.050 As used in NRS 574.050 to 574.200, inclusive [:], and section 1 of this act:
- 17 1. "Animal" does not include the human race, but includes every other
- 18 living creature.

- 2. "Torture" or "cruelty" includes every act, omission or neglect, whereby unjustifiable physical pain, suffering or death is caused or permitted.
