SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Designating February 22, 1999, as “Boulder City Day” at the Nevada Legislature.

- 1 WHEREAS, The Boulder Canyon Project and the construction of the
- 2 Hoover Dam was the most significant American public works project of
- 3 this century; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Boulder City was the town created to house over 4,000
- 5 workers who built Hoover Dam; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Boulder City appears on the National Register as a historic
- 7 place worthy of recognition and preservation for its significant
- 8 contribution to the State of Nevada and our Nation’s heritage; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The unique inception of Boulder City is still reflected today
- 10 through its controlled growth policy and commitment to enhancing the
- 11 quality of life of its residents; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The dedication of the residents of Boulder City to the best
- 13 interests of the State of Nevada is evidenced by their participation in
- 14 governmental issues and is reflected by a high voter turnout at elections;
- 15 now, therefore, be it
- 16 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY
- 17 CONCURRING, That February 22, 1999, is hereby designated as “Boulder
- 18 City Day” at the Nevada Legislature to commemorate the contributions of

1 the pioneers of Boulder City in the construction of the Hoover Dam and
2 for the continuing dedication of its residents to the State of Nevada; and be

5 copy of this resolution to Robert Ferraro, Mayor of Boulder City.

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
