
SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 12—SENATOR JACOBSEN (BY REQUEST)

FEBRUARY 25, 1999

Referred to Committee on Natural Resources

SUMMARY—Encourages Congress to support establishment of working partnership between federal land management agencies and local governments on issues relating to grazing of livestock on public lands. (BDR R-1248)

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Encouraging Congress to support the establishment of a working partnership between federal land management agencies and local governments on issues relating to the grazing of livestock on public lands.

- 1 WHEREAS, The livestock industry comprises a significant portion of the
2 rural economy of the State of Nevada; and
3 WHEREAS, Recent declines in the authorization of the grazing of
4 livestock on public lands in this state and throughout the West have had
5 measurable negative impacts on the economic viability of ranchers and
6 rural communities; and
7 WHEREAS, Studies by federal agencies have revealed that public lands
8 have improved or are improving through the use of controlled grazing of
9 livestock on public lands; and
10 WHEREAS, Recent management policies and directives established by
11 federal agencies including the Bureau of Land Management of the United
12 States Department of the Interior and the Forest Service of the United
13 States Department of Agriculture have resulted in significant and costly
14 reductions in the number of livestock allowed to graze on public lands in
15 this state; and
16 WHEREAS, These reductions are having a negative effect on the value of
17 ranches and the economic viability of ranchers who depend on the use of
18 public land for the successful production of livestock, resulting in an
19 adverse effect on the economic condition of the State of Nevada; and
20 WHEREAS, Continuation of these federal policies will have adverse
21 effects that are far reaching and costly, including an increase in wildfires, a

1 diminished tax base, loss of wildlife habitat and a decrease in economic
2 activity; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA,
4 JOINTLY, That the members of the Nevada Legislature do hereby
5 encourage the United States Congress to support all efforts for the
6 establishment of a working partnership between federal land management
7 agencies, local governments and other interested parties on issues relating
8 to the use of public lands; and be it further

9 RESOLVED, That this legislative body supports all efforts to review the
10 methodologies and practices that have been employed by public land
11 management agencies which have resulted in the unnecessary reduction in
12 the use of public lands by ranchers for the grazing of livestock; and be it
13 further

14 RESOLVED, That the Division of Agriculture of the Department of
15 Business and Industry is hereby encouraged to develop a statewide
16 database to further demonstrate the cumulative losses to this state and its
17 counties because of the reduction in the use of public land for the grazing
18 of livestock; and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and transmit a copy
20 of this resolution to the Vice President of the United States as presiding
21 officer of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the
22 Secretary of the Interior, the Secretary of Agriculture, each member of the
23 Nevada Congressional Delegation and the Executive Director of the
24 Nevada Association of Counties; and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon passage and
26 approval.
