

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 7—SENATOR O’CONNELL

SUMMARY—Urges members of Nevada Congressional Delegation to support legislation requiring portion of United States Constitution to appear on \$1 bill. (BDR R-162)

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Urging the members of the Nevada Congressional Delegation to support legislation requiring a portion of the United States Constitution to appear on the \$1 Federal reserve note.

- 1 WHEREAS, It is important that Americans be aware of the significance
- 2 of the Constitution of the United States; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The appearance of a portion of the Constitution of the
- 4 United States upon the \$1 Federal reserve note would remind each person
- 5 who uses the note of the historical significance of the Constitution and the
- 6 current impact of the Constitution upon the life of that person; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Congress is currently considering the enactment of the
- 8 Liberty Dollar Bill Act, an act that requires a portion of the Constitution of
- 9 the United States, specifically, the preamble, a list of the first 10
- 10 amendments and a list of the Articles, to appear on one side of the \$1
- 11 Federal reserve note; now, therefore, be it
- 12 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA,
- 13 JOINTLY, That the Legislature of the State of Nevada urges each member
- 14 of the Nevada Congressional Delegation to support legislation requiring a
- 15 portion of the Constitution of the United States to appear on one side of the
- 16 \$1 Federal reserve note; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and transmit a
- 18 copy of this resolution to each member of the Nevada Congressional
- 19 Delegation; and be it further

1 RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon passage and
2 approval.

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
