SUMMARY—Requires boards of trustees of certain school districts to provide transportation for certain pupils. (BDR 34-37)

AN ACT relating to the transportation of pupils; requiring the boards of trustees of certain school districts to provide transportation for pupils who reside a certain distance from school; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 392.300 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 392.300 1. As provided in this Title, the board of trustees of any
- 3 school district may , *subject to the requirements of subsection 2*, furnish
- 4 transportation for all resident children of school age in the school district
- 5 attending a public school, including pupils assigned to special schools or
- 6 programs pursuant to NRS 388.440 to 388.520, inclusive:
- 7 (a) Who are not excused from school attendance by the provisions of
- 8 this Title; and
- 9 (b) Who reside within the school district at such a distance from the
- 10 school as to make transportation necessary and desirable.
- 11 2. ~~When~~ *If the board of trustees of a school district in a county*
- 12 *whose population is 100,000 or more furnishes transportation pursuant*
- 13 *to subsection 1, the board of trustees shall provide transportation for all*
- 14 *the pupils attending;*

- 1     (a) *Elementary schools of the school district who reside 1.5 miles or*  
2     *more from their school of attendance.*  
3     (b) *Junior high or middle schools of the school district who reside 2*  
4     *miles or more from their school of attendance.*  
5     (c) *High schools of the school district who reside 3 miles or more from*  
6     *their school of attendance.*  
7     *This subsection is intended to express a mandatory minimum and does*  
8     *not prohibit the board of trustees from providing transportation for*  
9     *pupils who reside a shorter distance from their school of attendance than*  
10    *the distances set forth in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).*  
11    3. If the board of trustees of a school district *in a county* whose  
12    population is less than 100,000 furnishes transportation for pupils attending  
13    public schools pursuant to subsection 1, the board *of trustees* may also  
14    provide transportation for all resident children of school age in the school  
15    district attending private schools not operated for profit, over bus routes  
16    established for pupils attending public schools. If such transportation is  
17    provided, the pupils attending such private schools must be transported, if  
18    space is available, to and from the points on the established routes nearest  
19    to the schools which they attend.  
20    ~~3-1~~ 4. The board of trustees of any school district may:  
21    (a) Establish bus routes.  
22    (b) Make regulations governing the conduct of pupils while being  
23    transported.  
24    (c) For the safety of pupils being transported, govern the conduct of  
25    drivers by making and enforcing regulations not inconsistent with  
26    regulations of the state board ~~of education~~ or with law.  
27    Sec. 2. The provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 354.599 do not apply  
28    to any additional expenses of a local government that are related to the  
29    provisions of this act.  
30    Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2001.
