AN ACT relating to foster children; imposing liability on the state for certain damages caused by foster children; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 424 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. The division is jointly and severally liable with a foster child and any other persons against whom liability is imposed by law, for any actual damages sustained:
- (a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (b), to the private property of another person or to public property caused by the willful misconduct of the foster child.
- (b) By another person, to the property of another person or to public property caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the foster child when driving a motor vehicle.
- 2. The joint and several liability of the division established pursuant to this section must not exceed \$10,000 for any act of a foster child.
- 3. The liability imposed pursuant to this section is in addition to any other liability imposed by law.

- (a) Itself against any liability arising under this section.
- 18 (b) Against the expense of defending a claim against itself whether or not liability exists on such a claim.
 - 5. As used in this section, "foster child" means a child in the foster care of a person who is licensed by the division pursuant to NRS 424.030 to conduct a family foster home or group foster home.



- Sec. 2. The liability imposed pursuant to section 1 of this act does not apply to any act committed by a foster child before July 1, 2001.
 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2001.
