

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 19—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

SUMMARY—Creates forecast council and related technical advisory committees to produce long-term forecasts of state revenues and expenditures and estimates of impacts of proposed programs. (BDR 31-203)

AN ACT relating to state financial administration; providing in skeleton form for the creation of the forecast council and related technical advisory committees to produce long-term forecasts of state revenues and expenditures and estimates of impacts of proposed programs; establishing the projections and forecasts of the forecast council as the official long-term forecasts of this state for budgetary purposes; expanding the duties of the office of financial analysis and planning of the fiscal analysis division of the legislative counsel bureau to support the forecast council and related technical advisory committees; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** Chapter 353 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto
- 2 the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 7, inclusive, of this act.
- 3 **Sec. 2. 1. *The forecast council is hereby created. The forecast***
- 4 ***council consists of seven members, as follows:***
- 5 ***(a) The governor or an employee of the executive department***
- 6 ***designated by the governor;***
- 7 ***(b) The speaker of the assembly or a member of the assembly***
- 8 ***designated by the speaker;***
- 9 ***(c) The majority leader of the senate or a senator designated by the***
- 10 ***majority leader;***



- 1 (d) An employee of the executive department, designated by the  
2 governor, who is:
- 3 (1) An expert with demonstrated ability in the field of economics,  
4 taxation or other discipline necessary to economic forecasting; and  
5 (2) Able to bring knowledge and professional judgment to the  
6 deliberations of the forecast council; and
- 7 (e) Three persons, appointed by the governor, each of whom is:
- 8 (1) An expert with demonstrated ability in the field of economics,  
9 taxation, demography, urban planning, accounting, finance or other  
10 discipline necessary to economic planning or forecasting;  
11 (2) Able to bring knowledge and professional judgment to the  
12 deliberations of the forecast council; and  
13 (3) Not an elected officer, state officer or employee of this state or  
14 any political subdivision of this state unless he is an officer or employee  
15 at an institution of higher education.
- 16 2. The governor shall appoint the members of the forecast council  
17 required pursuant to paragraph (e) of subsection 1 not later than the date  
18 of the expiration of the term of the members previously appointed  
19 pursuant to paragraph (e) of subsection 1. If a vacancy occurs before the  
20 expiration of the term of such a member, the governor shall make an  
21 appointment to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term  
22 not later than 30 days after the vacancy occurs. The governor shall notify  
23 the director of the legislative counsel bureau of the name of each  
24 member appointed pursuant to this subsection or paragraph (e) of  
25 subsection 1 not later than 15 days after the appointment occurs.
- 26 3. A member of the forecast council appointed pursuant to  
27 paragraph (e) of subsection 1:
- 28 (a) Serves for a term of 4 years; and  
29 (b) May be reappointed.
- 30 4. If designated pursuant to paragraphs (a) to (d), inclusive, of  
31 subsection 1, a member of the forecast council serves at the pleasure of  
32 the officer or legislator empowered to designate that member.
- 33 5. The forecast council shall:
- 34 (a) Hold at least one meeting after September 1 but not later than  
35 October 31 of each odd-numbered year;  
36 (b) At its first meeting after September 1 of each odd-numbered year:  
37 (1) Elect a chairman from among its members appointed pursuant  
38 to paragraph (e) of subsection 1; and  
39 (2) Elect a vice chairman from among its members;  
40 (c) Adopt such rules governing the conduct of the forecast council as  
41 it deems necessary; and  
42 (d) Hold meetings as necessary to accomplish the tasks assigned to it  
43 in the time allotted.
- 44 6. The director of the legislative counsel bureau and the director of  
45 the department of administration shall jointly provide the forecast  
46 council with:
- 47 (a) Meeting rooms;  
48 (b) Staff;  
49 (c) Data processing services; and



1 (d) Clerical assistance.

2 7. A majority of the members of the forecast council constitutes a  
3 quorum, and a majority of those present must concur in any decision.

4 8. While engaged in the business of the forecast council, a member  
5 described in paragraph (e) of subsection 1, other than a member who is  
6 an officer or employee of this state at an institution of higher education,  
7 is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided  
8 for state officers and employees generally. In addition, such a member is  
9 entitled to receive for each meeting of the forecast council:

10 (a) Eighty dollars for 1 day of preparation for that meeting; and

11 (b) Eighty dollars for each day or part of a day during which the  
12 meeting lasts.

13 9. A member of the forecast council described in paragraph (a) or (d)  
14 of subsection 1, and a member described in paragraph (e) of subsection 1  
15 who is an officer or employee of this state at an institution of higher  
16 education, must be relieved from his duties without loss of his regular  
17 compensation so that he may prepare for and attend meetings of the  
18 forecast council and perform any work necessary to accomplish the tasks  
19 assigned to the forecast council in the most timely manner practicable. A  
20 state agency shall not require such a member of the forecast council to  
21 make up the time he is absent from work to fulfill his obligations as a  
22 member and shall not require the member to take annual vacation or  
23 compensatory time for the absence. Such a member shall serve on the  
24 forecast council without additional compensation, except that while he is  
25 engaged in the business of the forecast council, he is entitled to receive  
26 the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers  
27 and employees generally, which must be paid by the state agency that  
28 employs him.

29 10. Each legislator who is a member of the forecast council pursuant  
30 to paragraph (b) or (c) of subsection 1 is entitled to receive:

31 (a) Except during a regular or special session of the legislature, the  
32 compensation provided for a majority of the members of the legislature  
33 during the first 60 days of the preceding regular session for each day or  
34 portion of a day during which he attends a meeting of the forecast  
35 council and for 1 day of preparation for that meeting; and

36 (b) The per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state  
37 officers and employees generally.

38 11. The compensation, per diem allowance and travel expenses  
39 provided in subsection 10 must be paid from the legislative fund.

40 Sec. 3. 1. The forecast council shall:

41 (a) Make such projections for economic indicators as it deems  
42 necessary to ensure that forecasts are produced as required by  
43 paragraphs (b) and (c);

44 (b) Provide a forecast of the revenue that will be collected by this state  
45 during the decennium that begins on July 1 of the year following the date  
46 of the meeting required by paragraph (a) of subsection 5 of section 2 of  
47 this act;



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- 1     (c) Provide a forecast of the expenditures of this state during the  
2     decennium that begins on July 1 of the year following the date of the  
3     meeting required by paragraph (a) of subsection 5 of section 2 of this act;
- 4     (d) Request such technical assistance as the forecast council deems  
5     necessary from the revenue technical advisory committee, the  
6     expenditure technical advisory committee, and the office of financial  
7     analysis and planning of the fiscal analysis division of the legislative  
8     counsel bureau; and
- 9     (e) On or before March 1 of each even-numbered year, prepare a  
10    written report of its projections and forecasts required by paragraphs (a),  
11   (b) and (c) and present the report to:
- 12       (1) The governor, for distribution to the budget division of the  
13       department of administration and other appropriate agencies; and
- 14       (2) The director of the legislative counsel bureau, for distribution to  
15       each legislator and appropriate employees of the legislative counsel  
16       bureau.
- 17    2. At any time, the chairman of the forecast council may call for a  
18    review of the projections and forecasts contained in the most recent  
19    report presented pursuant to this subsection or subsection 1. Upon a call  
20    for a review, the forecast council shall meet to consider revising the  
21    projections and forecasts. If the forecast council revises the projections  
22    and forecasts, the forecast council shall prepare a new report and present  
23    the new report to the governor and the director of the legislative counsel  
24    bureau as required pursuant to subsection 1.
- 25    3. A report prepared pursuant to subsection 1 or 2 must include,  
26    without limitation:
- 27       (a) Projections and forecasts for each year of the decennium;
- 28       (b) A discussion of the changes from the projections and forecasts  
29       contained in the immediately preceding report;
- 30       (c) Specific identification and discussion of the changes from the  
31       projections and forecasts contained in the immediately preceding report  
32       caused by actions of the legislature during the immediately preceding  
33       legislative session; and
- 34       (d) A comparison of previous projections and forecasts with actual  
35       revenues, expenditures and related facts.
- 36    4. Before or during each regular session of the legislature, a person  
37    selected by the forecast council shall appear before:
- 38       (a) The budget subcommittee of the legislative commission appointed  
39       pursuant to NRS 218.6824; or
- 40       (b) The senate standing committee on finance and the assembly  
41       standing committee on ways and means,  
42       to discuss the projections and forecasts contained in the most recent  
43       report presented by the forecast council pursuant to subsection 1 or 2.
- 44    5. The forecast council may request information directly from any  
45    state agency. A state agency that receives a request for information from  
46    the forecast council shall comply with the request as soon as is  
47    practicable after receiving the request.



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1       6. To carry out its duties pursuant to this section, the forecast council  
2 may consider any information received from the revenue technical  
3 advisory committee, the expenditure technical advisory committee, the  
4 office of financial analysis and planning, and any other information  
5 received from independent sources.

6       7. Copies of the reports presented pursuant to subsection 1 or 2 must  
7 be made available to the public by the director of the legislative counsel  
8 bureau for the cost of reproducing the reports.

9       Sec. 4. The projections and forecasts contained in the most recent  
10 report presented pursuant to subsection 1 or 2 of section 3 of this act are  
11 the official long-term projections and forecasts of this state. Any  
12 difference between the official long-term projections and forecasts of this  
13 state and the projections and forecasts contained in or used for:

14       1. A budgetary request of a department, institution or agency of the  
15 executive department must be identified and explained in the budgetary  
16 request.

17       2. The proposed budget submitted by the governor pursuant to NRS  
18 353.230 must be identified and explained in the proposed budget.

19       Sec. 5. 1. The revenue technical advisory committee is hereby  
20 created. The committee consists of nine members, as follows:

21       (a) The senate fiscal analyst or an employee of the fiscal analysis  
22 division of the legislative counsel bureau designated by the senate fiscal  
23 analyst;

24       (b) The assembly fiscal analyst or an employee of the fiscal analysis  
25 division of the legislative counsel bureau designated by the assembly  
26 fiscal analyst;

27       (c) The chief of the budget division of the department of  
28 administration or an employee of the budget division designated by the  
29 chief;

30       (d) The chief of the research and analysis bureau of the division of  
31 information development and processing of the department of  
32 employment, training and rehabilitation or an employee of the bureau  
33 designated by the chief;

34       (e) The vice chancellor for finance of the University and Community  
35 College System of Nevada or an employee of the University and  
36 Community College System of Nevada designated by the vice chancellor;

37       (f) The demographer employed pursuant to NRS 360.283; and

38       (g) Three persons, appointed by the governor, each of whom is:

39       (1) An expert with demonstrated ability in the field of economics,  
40 taxation, demography, urban planning, accounting, finance or other  
41 discipline necessary to economic planning or forecasting;

42       (2) Able to bring knowledge and professional judgment to the  
43 deliberations of the committee; and

44       (3) Not an elected officer, state officer or employee of this state or  
45 any political subdivision of this state unless he is an officer or employee  
46 at an institution of higher education.

47       2. The governor shall appoint the members of the revenue technical  
48 advisory committee required pursuant to paragraph (g) of subsection 1  
49 not later than the date of the expiration of the term of the members



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1 *previously appointed pursuant to paragraph (g) of subsection 1. If a*  
2 *vacancy occurs before the expiration of the term of such a member, the*  
3 *governor shall make an appointment to fill the vacancy for the remainder*  
4 *of the unexpired term not later than 30 days after the vacancy occurs.*  
5 *The governor shall notify the director of the legislative counsel bureau of*  
6 *the name of each member appointed pursuant to this subsection or*  
7 *paragraph (g) of subsection 1 not later than 15 days after the*  
8 *appointment occurs.*

9 *3. A member of the revenue technical advisory committee appointed*  
10 *pursuant to paragraph (g) of subsection 1:*

11 *(a) Serves for a term of 4 years; and*

12 *(b) May be reappointed.*

13 *4. If designated pursuant to paragraphs (a) to (e), inclusive, of*  
14 *subsection 1, a member of the revenue technical advisory committee*  
15 *serves at the pleasure of the officer empowered to designate that member.*

16 *5. The revenue technical advisory committee shall:*

17 *(a) At its first meeting after September 1 of each odd-numbered year:*

18 *(1) Elect a chairman from among its members appointed pursuant*  
19 *to paragraph (g) of subsection 1; and*

20 *(2) Elect a vice chairman from among its members;*

21 *(b) Adopt such rules governing the conduct of the committee as it*  
22 *deems necessary;*

23 *(c) Hold meetings as necessary to carry out the requests made by the*  
24 *forecast council pursuant to section 3 of this act in the most timely*  
25 *manner practicable;*

26 *(d) Provide all assistance requested by the forecast council pursuant*  
27 *to section 3 of this act;*

28 *(e) After receiving a request pursuant to section 7 of this act for an*  
29 *estimate of the effect of a proposal:*

30 *(1) Prepare a written estimate of the effect, with regard to revenues,*  
31 *of the proposal upon the official long-term projections and forecasts of*  
32 *this state;*

33 *(2) Present the written estimate prepared pursuant to subparagraph*  
34 *(1) to:*

35 *(I) The forecast council;*

36 *(II) The governor, for distribution to the budget division of the*  
37 *department of administration and other appropriate agencies; and*

38 *(III) The director of the legislative counsel bureau, for*  
39 *distribution to each legislator and appropriate employees of the*  
40 *legislative counsel bureau; and*

41 *(3) Present the written estimate, as required by subparagraph (2),*  
42 *not later than:*

43 *(I) March 1 following the commencement of the regular*  
44 *legislative session if the proposal is contained in the proposed budget*  
45 *submitted by the governor pursuant to NRS 353.230; or*

46 *(II) Ninety days after the commencement of the regular*  
47 *legislative session if the proposal is contained in a legislative measure;*  
48 *and*



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1     (f) Request such technical assistance as the committee deems  
2     necessary from the office of financial analysis and planning of the fiscal  
3     analysis division of the legislative counsel bureau.

4     6. A majority of the members of the revenue technical advisory  
5     committee constitutes a quorum, and a majority of those present must  
6     concur in any decision.

7     7. While engaged in the business of the revenue technical advisory  
8     committee, a member described in paragraph (g) of subsection 1, other  
9     than a member who is an officer or employee of this state at an  
10    institution of higher education, is entitled to receive the per diem  
11    allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees  
12    generally. In addition, such a member is entitled to receive for each  
13    meeting of the committee:

14    (a) Eighty dollars for 1 day of preparation for that meeting; and

15    (b) Eighty dollars for each day or part of a day during which the  
16    meeting lasts.

17    8. A member of the revenue technical advisory committee described  
18    in paragraphs (a) to (f), inclusive, of subsection 1, and a member  
19    described in paragraph (g) of subsection 1 who is an officer or employee  
20    of this state at an institution of higher education, must be relieved from  
21    his duties without loss of his regular compensation so that he may  
22    prepare for and attend meetings of the committee and perform any work  
23    necessary to accomplish the tasks assigned to the committee in the most  
24    timely manner practicable. A state agency shall not require such a  
25    member of the committee to make up the time he is absent from work to  
26    fulfill his obligations as a member and shall not require the member to  
27    take annual vacation or compensatory time for the absence. Such a  
28    member shall serve on the committee without additional compensation,  
29    except that while he is engaged in the business of the committee, he is  
30    entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided  
31    for state officers and employees generally, which must be paid by the  
32    state agency that employs him.

33    9. The revenue technical advisory committee may request  
34    information from any state agency. A state agency that receives a request  
35    for information from the committee shall comply with the request as soon  
36    as is practicable after receiving the request.

37    10. The director of the legislative counsel bureau and the director of  
38    the department of administration shall jointly provide the revenue  
39    technical advisory committee with:

40    (a) Meeting rooms;

41    (b) Staff;

42    (c) Data processing services; and

43    (d) Clerical assistance.

44    Sec. 6. 1. The expenditure technical advisory committee is hereby  
45    created. The committee consists of 11 members, as follows:

46    (a) The senate fiscal analyst or an employee of the fiscal analysis  
47    division of the legislative counsel bureau designated by the senate fiscal  
48    analyst;





1 (b) The assembly fiscal analyst or an employee of the fiscal analysis  
2 division of the legislative counsel bureau designated by the assembly  
3 fiscal analyst;

4 (c) The chief of the budget division of the department of  
5 administration or an employee of the budget division designated by the  
6 chief;

7 (d) The chief of the research and analysis bureau of the division of  
8 information development and processing of the department of  
9 employment, training and rehabilitation or an employee of the bureau  
10 designated by the chief;

11 (e) The vice chancellor for finance of the University and Community  
12 College System of Nevada or an employee of the University and  
13 Community College System of Nevada designated by the vice chancellor;

14 (f) The superintendent of public instruction or an employee of the  
15 department of education designated by the superintendent of public  
16 instruction who has expertise in the budget and expenditure programs of  
17 the department;

18 (g) The director of the department of prisons or an employee of the  
19 department designated by the director who has expertise in the budget  
20 and expenditure programs of the department;

21 (h) The director of the department of human resources or an  
22 employee of the department designated by the director who has expertise  
23 in the budget and expenditure programs of the department;

24 (i) The demographer employed pursuant to NRS 360.283;

25 (j) A person, appointed by the governor, who is an officer or employee  
26 of a local government of this state; and

27 (k) A person, appointed by the governor, who is:

28 (1) An expert with demonstrated ability in the field of economics,  
29 taxation, demography, urban planning, accounting, finance or other  
30 discipline necessary to economic planning or forecasting;

31 (2) Able to bring knowledge and professional judgment to the  
32 deliberations of the committee; and

33 (3) Not an elected officer, state officer or employee of this state or  
34 any political subdivision of this state unless he is an officer or employee  
35 at an institution of higher education.

36 2. The governor shall appoint the members of the expenditure  
37 technical advisory committee required pursuant to paragraphs (j) and (k)  
38 of subsection 1 not later than the date of the expiration of the term of the  
39 members previously appointed pursuant to paragraphs (j) and (k) of  
40 subsection 1. If a vacancy occurs before the expiration of the term of  
41 such a member, the governor shall make an appointment to fill the  
42 vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term not later than 30 days  
43 after the vacancy occurs. The governor shall notify the director of the  
44 legislative counsel bureau of the name of each member appointed  
45 pursuant to this subsection or paragraph (j) or (k) of subsection 1 not  
46 later than 15 days after the appointment occurs.



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- 1     3. The member of the expenditure technical advisory committee  
2 appointed pursuant to paragraph (k) of subsection 1 shall serve as  
3 chairman of the committee. A member of the committee appointed  
4 pursuant to paragraph (j) or (k) of subsection 1:  
5     (a) Serves for a term of 4 years; and  
6     (b) May be reappointed.
- 7     4. If designated pursuant to paragraphs (a) to (h), inclusive, of  
8 subsection 1, a member of the expenditure technical advisory committee  
9 serves at the pleasure of the officer empowered to designate that member.
- 10    5. The expenditure technical advisory committee shall:  
11    (a) At its first meeting after September 1 of each odd-numbered year,  
12 elect a vice chairman from among its members;  
13    (b) Adopt such rules governing the conduct of the committee as it  
14 deems necessary;  
15    (c) Hold meetings as necessary to carry out the requests made by the  
16 forecast council pursuant to section 3 of this act in the most timely  
17 manner practicable;  
18    (d) Provide all assistance requested by the forecast council pursuant  
19 to section 3 of this act;  
20    (e) After receiving a request pursuant to section 7 of this act for an  
21 estimate of the effect of a proposal:  
22    (1) Prepare a written estimate of the effect, with regard to  
23 expenditures, of the proposal upon the official long-term projections and  
24 forecasts of this state;  
25    (2) Present the written estimate prepared pursuant to subparagraph  
26 (1) to:  
27    (I) The forecast council;  
28    (II) The governor, for distribution to the budget division of the  
29 department of administration and other appropriate agencies; and  
30    (III) The director of the legislative counsel bureau, for  
31 distribution to each legislator and appropriate employees of the  
32 legislative counsel bureau; and  
33    (3) Present the written estimate, as required by subparagraph (2),  
34 not later than:  
35    (I) March 1 following the commencement of the regular  
36 legislative session if the proposal is contained in the proposed budget  
37 submitted by the governor pursuant to NRS 353.230; or  
38    (II) Ninety days after the commencement of the regular  
39 legislative session if the proposal is contained in a legislative measure;  
40 and  
41    (f) Request such technical assistance as the committee deems  
42 necessary from the office of financial analysis and planning of the fiscal  
43 analysis division of the legislative counsel bureau.
- 44    6. A majority of the members of the expenditure technical advisory  
45 committee constitutes a quorum, and a majority of those present must  
46 concur in any decision.
- 47    7. While engaged in the business of the expenditure technical  
48 advisory committee, a member described in paragraph (k) of subsection  
49 1, other than a member who is an officer or employee of this state at an



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1 institution of higher education, is entitled to receive the per diem  
2 allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees  
3 generally. In addition, such a member is entitled to receive for each  
4 meeting of the committee:

5 (a) Eighty dollars for 1 day of preparation for that meeting; and

6 (b) Eighty dollars for each day or part of a day during which the  
7 meeting lasts.

8 8. A member of the expenditure technical advisory committee  
9 described in paragraphs (a) to (j), inclusive, of subsection 1, and a  
10 member described in paragraph (k) of subsection 1 who is an officer or  
11 employee of this state at an institution of higher education, must be  
12 relieved from his duties without loss of his regular compensation so that  
13 he may prepare for and attend meetings of the committee and perform  
14 any work necessary to accomplish the tasks assigned to the committee in  
15 the most timely manner practicable. A state agency shall not require such  
16 a member of the committee to make up the time he is absent from work to  
17 fulfill his obligations as a member and shall not require the member to  
18 take annual vacation or compensatory time for the absence. Such a  
19 member shall serve on the committee without additional compensation,  
20 except that while he is engaged in the business of the committee, he is  
21 entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided  
22 for state officers and employees generally, which must be paid by the  
23 state agency that employs him.

24 9. The expenditure technical advisory committee may request  
25 information from any state agency. A state agency that receives a request  
26 for information from the committee shall comply with the request as soon  
27 as is practicable after receiving the request.

28 10. The director of the legislative counsel bureau and the director of  
29 the department of administration shall jointly provide the expenditure  
30 technical advisory committee with:

31 (a) Meeting rooms;

32 (b) Staff;

33 (c) Data processing services; and

34 (d) Clerical assistance.

35 Sec. 7. 1. During each regular legislative session, the office of  
36 financial analysis and planning of the fiscal analysis division of the  
37 legislative counsel bureau shall request from the revenue technical  
38 advisory committee, the expenditure technical advisory committee, or  
39 both, as appropriate, an estimate of the effect of a proposal contained in  
40 the proposed budget submitted by the governor pursuant to NRS 353.230  
41 or in a legislative measure introduced not later than the 75th day of the  
42 session:

43 (a) Upon receipt of a request pursuant to subsection 2; or

44 (b) If the proposal:

45 (1) Modifies an existing revenue source or expenditure program or  
46 creates a new revenue source or expenditure program; and

47 (2) Has a projected fiscal impact, during the first complete year the  
48 proposal would be in effect, equal to or greater than 2 percent of the  
49 estimated future state revenue for the second year of the immediately



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1 *succeeding biennium as estimated by the economic forum on or before*  
2 *the immediately preceding December 1 pursuant to paragraph (d) of*  
3 *subsection 1 of NRS 353.228.*

4 2. *During each regular legislative session, not later than the 75th day*  
5 *of the session:*

6 (a) *The governor may, not more than twice;*

7 (b) *The speaker of the assembly may, not more than once; and*

8 (c) *The majority leader of the senate may, not more than once,*  
9 *request an estimate of the effect of a proposal contained in the proposed*  
10 *budget submitted by the governor pursuant to NRS 353.230 or in a*

18 (b) *If the proposal is contained in a legislative measure introduced not*  
19 *later than the 75th day of the session, the estimate or projection of the*
