AN ACT relating to crimes; prohibiting a person from directing light emitted from a laser pointer into or through certain places and at certain persons under certain circumstances; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 202 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.
- Sec. 2. As used in this section and sections 3 and 4 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, "laser pointer" means a device that emits light amplified by the stimulated emission of radiation that is visible to the human eye. The term includes, without limitation, a laser scope intended for use with a firearm.
- Sec. 3. 1. A person shall not knowingly direct light emitted from a laser pointer into or through a public place or at another person in a manner that would cause a reasonable person apprehension or fear of bodily harm, unless the person does so for a valid and lawful purpose.
- 12 2. A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a 13 misdemeanor.
  - Sec. 4. 1. A person shall not knowingly direct light emitted from a laser pointer at a uniformed peace officer, security guard, traffic officer, firefighter, emergency medical attendant or ambulance driver or attendant.

- 2. A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
  - 3. As used in this section:
- (a) "Emergency medical attendant" has the meaning ascribed to it in 5 NRS 41.139.
- (b) "Security guard" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 648.016.
  Sec. 5. The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses committed before October 1, 2001.
