AN ACT relating to the practice of law; revising the provisions governing the unauthorized practice of law; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 7.285 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 7.285 1. A person shall not practice law in this state, use any name, title or description which indicates that he is currently authorized to practice law in this state, represent himself in any manner as an attorney and counselor, attorney at law or lawyer, or appear before a court, magistrate, arbitrator or other tribunal in this state on behalf of another person, if the person:
- (a) Is not an active member of the State Bar of Nevada or otherwise authorized to practice law in this state pursuant to the rules of the supreme court; or
- (b) Is suspended or has been disbarred from membership in the State Bar of Nevada pursuant to the rules of the supreme court.
 - 2. A person who violates any provision of subsection 1 is guilty of:
- (a) For a first offense within the immediately preceding 7 years, a misdemeanor.
- (b) For a second offense within the immediately preceding 7 years, a gross misdemeanor.
- 18 (c) For a third and any subsequent offense within the immediately preceding 7 years, a category E felony and shall be punished as provided in NRS 193.130.



3. The State Bar of Nevada may bring a civil action to secure an injunction and any other appropriate relief against a person who violates this section.

- **Sec. 2.** 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses committed before October 1, 2001.
- The amendatory provisions of this act apply to offenses committed before October 1, 2001, for the purpose of determining whether a person is subject to the provisions of paragraph (b) or (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 7.285, as amended by this act.
