AN ACT relating to crimes; prohibiting a person from interfering with certain emergency medical attendants while rendering assistance; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 207 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. It is unlawful for a person to obstruct, impede or prevent an emergency medical attendant from rendering assistance to another person who is sick or injured when the person knows or has reason to know that the person rendering assistance is an emergency medical attendant.
- 2. Unless a greater penalty is otherwise provided by law, a person who violates the provisions of subsection 1 is guilty of a category E felony and shall be punished as provided in NRS 193.130.

 3. As used in this section, "emergency medical attendant" means a 10
 - person licensed as an attendant or certified as an emergency medical technician, intermediate emergency medical technician or advanced
- emergency medical technician pursuant to chapter 450B of NRS.

 Sec. 2. The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses committed before October 1, 2001. 15 16
