2. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for either fiscal year. Any balance of those sums must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2003, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.

(a) Establish and maintain records concerning the use of the money appropriated by subsection 1 which conform to generally accepted accounting practices; and

(b) Provide a written report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the Legislative Commission on or before January 1, 2003, which clearly describes the expenditures made from the money appropriated by subsection 1 and their benefit to the state.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
