## CHAPTER.....

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; prohibiting in certain circumstances a person from operating a sound amplification system in a motor vehicle in a certain manner; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 484 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the driver of a motor vehicle shall not operate or allow the operation of a sound amplification system in the motor vehicle in such a manner that the sound emanating from the sound amplification system is audible from a distance of more than 25 feet from the motor vehicle when the motor vehicle is being operated upon a highway.
  - 2. The provisions of this section do not apply to:
- (a) A sound amplification system that is being operated to request assistance or warn of a hazardous situation.
- (b) An emergency vehicle or other vehicle that is authorized to be equipped with an audible warning signal.
- (c) A vehicle that is authorized by a permit issued by the proper public authority to operate a sound amplification system in a parade or other authorized procession.
- (d) A vehicle that is used as part of a licensed business which operates a sound amplification system to advertise the business.
- 3. As used in this section, "sound amplification system" means a radio, compact disc player, cassette player or similar device.
- **Sec. 2.** The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to offenses committed before July 1, 2001.
  - **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2001.
