AN ACT relating to protection from fire; providing in skeleton form for the formation of a regional fire protection district in certain counties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Title 42 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new chapter to consist of the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 6, inclusive, of this act.

4 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise provides, "district" means a regional fire protection district.

Sec. 3. In a county whose population is 100,000 or more but less than 400,000, the board of county commissioners and the governing body of one or more incorporated cities in the county may establish a regional fire protection district. To establish such a district, the participating political subdivisions must each conduct a public hearing on the matter and adopt a resolution approving the establishment of the district.

Sec. 4. The district must be governed by a board of directors. The participating political subdivisions shall provide for the composition and election of the board by interlocal agreement.

Sec. 5. The board of directors shall:

1. Manage and conduct the business and affairs of the district.

2. Make and enforce all rules and regulations necessary for the administration and government of the district and for the furnishing of fire protection thereto, which may include regulations relating to fire prevention.

3. Organize, regulate, establish and disband fire companies, departments or volunteer fire departments for the district.



- 4. Make and execute in the name of the district all necessary contracts.
- 5. Adopt a seal for the district to be used in the attestation of proper documents.
- 6. Provide for the payment from the proper fund of all the debts and just claims against the district.
- 7. Employ agents and employees for the district sufficient to maintain and operate the property acquired for the purposes of the district.
- 8. Acquire real or personal property necessary for the purposes of the district and dispose of that property when no longer needed.
 - 9. Construct any necessary structures.

- 10. Acquire, hold and possess, either by donation or purchase, in the name and on behalf of the district any land or other property necessary for the purpose of the district.
- 11. Eliminate and remove fire hazards within the district wherever practicable and possible, whether or not on private or public premises, and to that end the board may clear the public highways and private lands of dry grass, stubble, brush, rubbish or other inflammable material which, in its judgment, constitutes a fire hazard.
- 12. Perform all other acts necessary, proper and convenient to accomplish the purposes of the district.
- Sec. 6. 1. The board of directors may purchase, acquire by donation or otherwise, lease, operate and maintain ambulances whenever necessary, and may take out liability and other insurance therefor.
 - 2. The board of directors may employ trained personnel to operate these vehicles.
