ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Memorializing Julian Wallace.

- 1 WHEREAS, The members of the Nevada Legislature note with sadness
- 2 the passing of Julian Wallace on August 2, 2000; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Julian Walter Wallace was born on September 13, 1912, in
- 4 Brooklyn, New York; and
- 5 WHEREAS, After moving to California, Julian Wallace met Lillian
- 6 Kramer, the woman he would marry on January 17, 1948, and who would
- 7 become his partner in every endeavor from that day forward; and
- 8 WHEREAS, With their move to Nevada in 1978, Julian and Lillian
- 9 Wallace brought with them their deep involvement in various
- 10 organizations, including Julian's membership in the Fraternal Order of
- 11 Knights of Pythias, an international fraternity in which Julian served as
- 12 Chancellor Commander and whose principles of friendship, charity and
- 13 benevolence he incorporated into his daily life; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Lifetime members of the City of Hope, Julian and Lillian
- 15 Wallace worked as volunteers in many projects initiated to raise money for
- 16 the life-saving work of the City of Hope National Medical Center whose



1 mission is the prevention, treatment and cure of cancer and other life-  
2 threatening diseases through innovative research and patient care; and

3 WHEREAS, Active with the Mobile Homeowners League of the Silver  
4 State, Julian Wallace became its Executive Vice President in 1982, and it  
5 was as a representative of this organization that he became involved with  
6 Seniors United, a coalition of senior citizen activist groups formed during  
7 the election year of 1982 to win election for candidates who supported their  
8 views; and

9 WHEREAS, While many of the senior groups dissolved after the election,  
10 Julian and Lillian Wallace felt that an organization with the potential of  
11 Seniors United should not be discarded and took over the leadership which  
12 they would retain for the next 17 years, changing its focus to a political  
13 education organization dedicated to developing the political knowledge of  
14 seniors with forums for discussions and presentations of topical issues  
15 while challenging the members to recognize the strength of their collective  
16 voting power; and

17 WHEREAS, The team of Julian and Lillian Wallace has received  
18 numerous honors and awards for their achievements while directing the  
19 course of Seniors United including a recognition by Senator Harry Reid  
20 recorded in the Congressional Record of November 7, 1997, in which he  
21 paid tribute to "two Nevadans whose lives serve as an inspiration not only  
22 to all Nevadans but to this Nation and to this distinguished body" and he  
23 noted further that they "never hesitate to hold their elected officials' feet to  
24 the fire and demonstrate on a daily basis that an active and involved  
25 citizenry is definitely not a function of age."; and

26 WHEREAS, Never one to take retirement as a time to slow down, Julian  
27 Wallace also served on the Clark County Parks and Recreation Board, was  
28 active with the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program and was a delegate  
29 to the 1995 White House Conference on Aging, which was followed by a  
30 special invitation to the 1997 presidential inauguration; and

31 WHEREAS, The cheerful, positive demeanor and the ever-present smile  
32 of Julian Wallace will be missed by those who knew him and were drawn  
33 by the magnetic personality that made him irresistible to people of all ages;  
34 and

35 WHEREAS, Julian Wallace is survived by his wife, Lillian, who said of  
36 their 52 1/2 years together that "we enjoyed every minute of it," and by his  
37 brothers, Theodore of Los Angeles, California, and Martin Rock of  
38 Scottsdale, Arizona; now, therefore, be it

39 RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE SENATE  
40 CONCURRING, That the members of the 71st session of the Nevada  
41 Legislature extend their sincere condolences to Lillian Wallace on the loss  
42 of her loving husband and closest friend; and be it further

43 RESOLVED, That Julian Wallace will long be remembered for his  
44 commitment to the Pythian principles of "service to mankind" and "peace  
45 through understanding" and as a man who made everyone his friend; and  
46 be it further
